BRITISH AMBASSADOR STOPPED BY CHEERS

Sir Esme Howard Was Presenting Medal for Essay in Washington.

Washington, Feb. 24.-An audience of 5,000 persons stood for several minutes and cheered yesterday at a George Washington celebration when the British Ambassador, Sir Esme Howard, began the presentation of a prize to a young woman for an essay on an incident of the American revolution.

Numbers of diplomatic and Government officials were in the audience which applauded with enthusiasm that the Ambassador had difficulty in proceeding. One of those present was Secretary of State Hughes.

The demonstration occurred when the Ambassador was presenting gold medal to Miss Katherine Parsons of Gunstan Hall School, for her essay on The Surrender of Yorktown, October 19th, 1781; Its Influence for the Welfare of the British Empire.'

Discussing the revolution, the Ambassador was saying that "the bitterness is fortunately gone and if any proof of that were needed it is that I have been chosen on this occasion to present this medal," when the applause broke forth.
