**SHIPMENT OF WHITE PINE FOR ADMIRALTY**

J. R. Booth Limited, Ottawa, Ships 51 Cars of Squared Timber to Quebec.

Ottawa, March 20.—Part of what is one of the greatest shipments of lumber ever handled by rail, unique in that it is the greatest movement of squared timber since the days when it was floated in rafts to the ports, left Ottawa for Quebec yesterday, when a train of 51 cars of white pine cut from the virgin growth of the J. R. Booth Limited Egan Estate near the head-waters of the Madawaska

River, situated in Preston and Clancy counties in Algonquin Park, transported the second consignment of an order of about 1,500,000 board measure feet for the British Admiralty.

Mr. J. R. Booth, who will be 95 on April 5th, and who himself attended to all details of the contract with the British Navy, as he does in all parts in his business, witnessed the passage of this second consignment through Ottawa on its journey of about 450 miles via C. N. R. to Quebec. Mr. Booth himself, and his two sons, Mrs. C. Jackson Booth, vice-president of the company, and Mr. J. Fred Booth, managing director, were photographed by the Ontario government movie camera man who "shot" the departure of the train. This event as filmed will be embodied in a reel depicting the passage of the timber from tree to train, and finally on board trans-Atlantic boats, that will be exhibited shortly in Ottawa and various parts of Canada, and in Great Britain and the continent.

This virgin growth of timber was purchased by Mr. J. R. Booth 71 years ago, and the trees range from 250 to 500 years old, up to 175 feet in height, and are clear of branches sheer for 100 feet. The hand squared sticks, reviving the process of hand hewn squared timber of the past, are as shipped 20 to 50 feet long, and 18 to 36 inches square. A record piece is 26 feet long and 26 inches square.

White pine, of which Eastern Canada has much of virgin quality in her natural resources, is of the greatest value because of its malleability and durability, and for these reasons, the British Admiralty buy Canadian white pine for pattern making and decking for battleships.
