THE STRICKEN AREAS STILL PROSTRATED

Between 850 and 900 Dead and 7,000 Injured in Ohio Valley.

Chicago, March 20 .- Still prostrated, but with hurried efforts at temporary relief supplemented the arrival of trained workers, supplies and medicines, the storm stricken areas of the Ohio Valley today continued to count the terrific loss in life and property of its greatest tornado catastrophe.

Fairly systematic checking in thirty-five cities and towns in the path of Wednesday afternoon's storm indicated a death list of between 850 and 900, with approximately 7,000 injured and many other thousand

Temporary morgues and hospitals were filled to overlowing while frantic men, women and children search long lines of dead for missing dear ones. In some instances, doctors performed major operations cut of doors without aneasthetics.
