A greater service is done in writing a thousand policies for a thousand dollars each than in writing one policy for a million dollars.

she should clearly realize that, while the Penitentiary Act has not been fundamentally amended since 1868,

a great change has nevertheless taken place during that period in the treatment of prisoners. On the whole, the change has been vindicated by results. Up to comparatively recent years, for example, no provision had been made for the education of the illiterate.

Access to wholesome and inspiring literature had no place in the prison scheme. There was no wisely organized plan of appeal to the higher and better instincts of men who had fallen into crime, which might send them out with a new and sane outlook on life.

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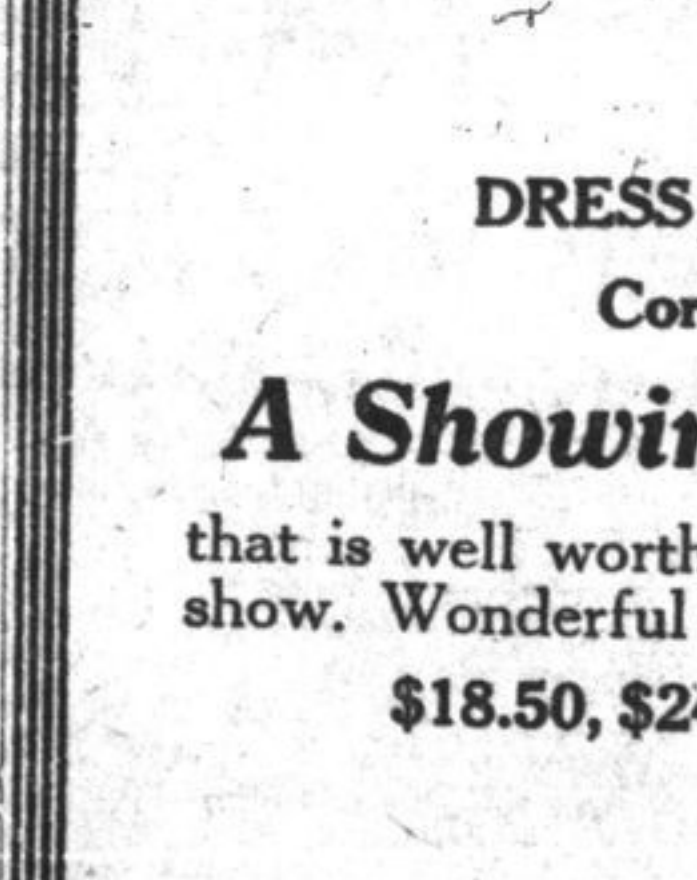
