## RESUME DISCUSSION

### OF CHURCH UNION BILL

Sub-committee of Ontario Legislature to Struggle With the Vexed Question.

Toronto, March 25.—Resumption of deliberations on the vexed question of the church union bill to be submitted to the Ontario legislature, was made at ten o'clock this morning by a subcommittee of the private bills committee which was appointed yesterday in an effort to draft a bill that would meet with general approval. Little progress was made yesterday at the afternoon meeting, according to corridor gossip this morning, the members entering into a general discussion of the so-called tentative agreement arrived last week by the negotiating committee composed of an equal number of church unionists and non-concurrenents under the chairmanship of Hon. W. F. Nickle, attorney-general.
