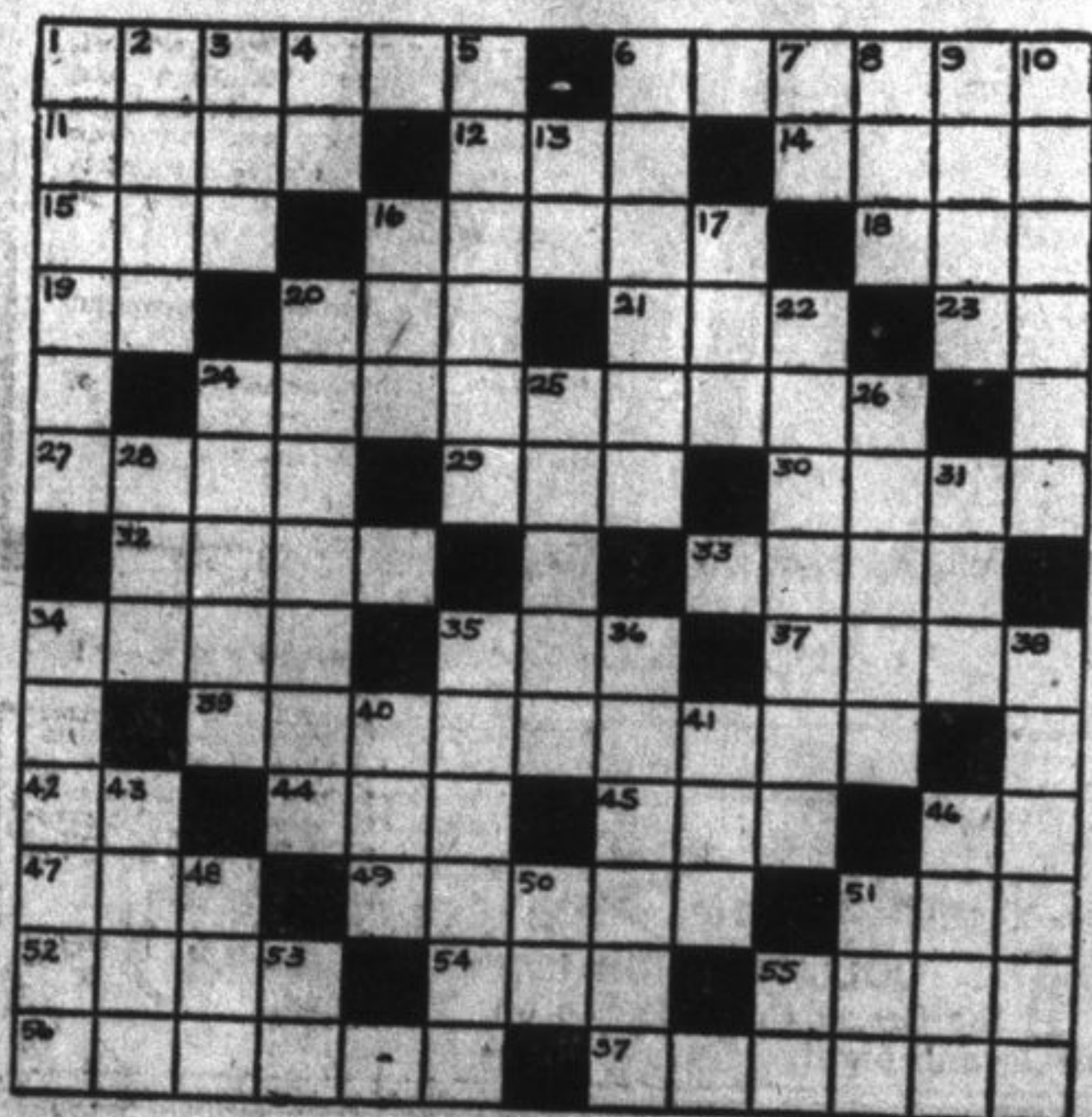

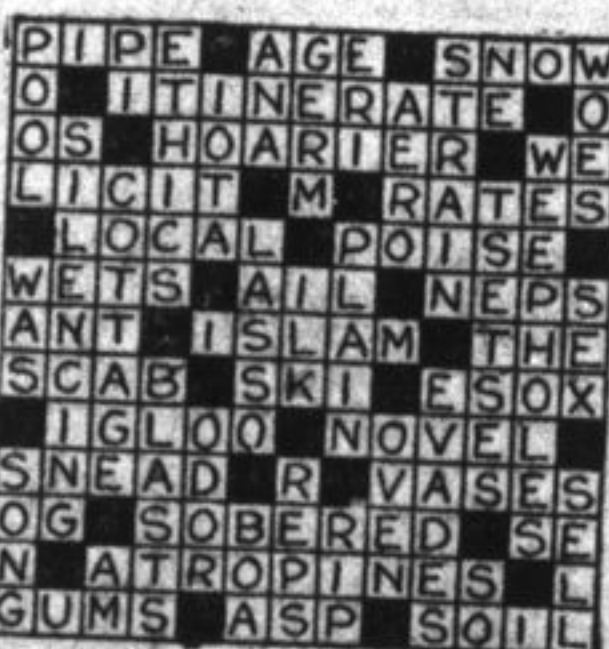

GIANTS HAVE MANAGERS.

Are Not Badly Off if McGraw Goes Under.

New York, April 18.—Should anything happen to John McGraw, the New York Giants are well fixed for managerial timber.

On the Giants' roster are no less than five former managers, headed by the redoubtable Hughey Jennings.

Last season when McGraw was kept away from the team for a number of weeks, Jennings handled the club and it went along smoothly to a fourth pennant.

Comment on the managerial ability of Jennings is unnecessary. He reached his peak with the Detroit Tigers winning three successive pennants for that city in 1907-08-09.

Two of McGraw's catching staff have done managerial duty. Grover Hartley handled the Columbus team of the American Association and Mickey Devine was in charge of Jersey City in the International.

Bill Terry, George Kelley's understudy at first base, for a time led the misfit Toledo team of the American Association. The team was a hopeless tailender when Bill took charge. He did well enough with a weak club.

Then there is Frank Walker who once had a trial with Connie Mack. Last season Walker managed the Rocky Mount club in the Virginia League. His contract made him a free agent at the close of the year.

Immediately he proved that he was a wise guy by selling himself to the Giants for \$11,000. He didn't cheat McGraw at that, for he looks the part of a finished ball player.

Thus it is apparent there is no reason for the Giants lacking managerial strategy with McGraw and five assistants in the squad.
