



THE HOME OF YOUR DREAMS



This little home should make a strong appeal to new homemakers. The average newly married couple starts homemaking in an apartment and some in surprisingly small apartments. The reason for this in most cases is undoubtedly on account of lack of sufficient capital to build or buy their own home. Then again there are altogether too few small and attractive houses to meet this demand. First of all the house must look the part, it must have something about it which brings it up to par with its larger neighbors.

The house shown here is the type which closely approaches the mark. The plan accommodations are far better than those found in the small apartment, to say nothing of the pride one feels in owning his own home. With a small amount of capital invested the expenses entailed in owning this type of home should compare favorably with apartment rentals.

The plan arrangement is somewhat of a departure from the usual small house layout. A living-room of good dimension serves a three-fold purpose, as a general living-room, dining-room and bedroom, by means of a swinging bed.

The small kitchen and breakfast-room are much in demand; likewise the attached garage. On the second floor are three good bedrooms and a bathroom. The exterior walls are stuccoed and the roof is of slate. Brick piers support the heavy wooden driveway gates. The roof over the entrance door is interesting.




