

No. 82.—Battle of the Standard.



A.D. 1138.—The supporters of Matilda were not idle. Ostensibly on her behalf, David of Scotland thrice ravaged Northumberland, and collected much plunder. On his third raid, the barons in their own defence joined forces and defeated David at the Battle of the Standard, near Northallerton. The following year, Stephen concluded a peace with David, whereby the whole of Northumberland, except Bamborough and Newcastle, was granted to the young Scottish Prince Henry.
