WON HIGH HONORS IN FIRST AID WORK

Team Representing Kingston Division of Bell Telephone Company, Captured First Prize.

The Kingston team was awarded a shield which will grace the wall in the plant department on Clarence street. In addition, each of the members of the team received a beautiful belt, with silver buckle, neatly engraved.
