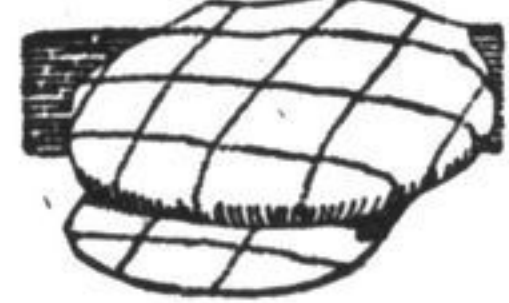

## THE DEAN WOULD HANG GUILTY DIVORCEES

To Allow Innocent Survivors to Marry Again Without Breaking Church Laws.

New York, May 9.—Very Rev. W. Ralph Inge, the "Gloomy Dean" of St. Paul's cathedral, London, advanced what he said was his personal solution of the divorce problem at a farewell luncheon given him by the Forum Magazine at the Century Club.

"I have sometimes thought," he said, "that the best thing would be to hang both of the guilty parties, so that the innocent survivors may marry again without breaking any laws of the church."

There was a grist of business put through at the meeting of the Kingston Amateur Baseball Club held in the Board of Trade rooms on Friday evening. President Steacy was in the chair and there was a full attendance of members of the executive.

Manager Joe Daley reported good turnouts to practices and is very much pleased with several of the new prospects although he says that all will have to step lively to get in shape for the opener here with Peterboro on May twentieth. Halbert, the Imperial Tobacco Company's contribution to the squad, was out last night and looked mighty good.

F. C. Beaudry was appointed official scorer for the season of 1925.

It was decided by an unanimous vote to make "Ted" Gallagher assistant manager of the team. The motion came from Treasurer Kennedy and was received with enthusiasm by the whole executive.

W. Arnel was appointed grounds manager again for the season.

The question of policing the fences was dealt with and satisfactory grounds arrangements with the city reported.

One important decision of special interest to the fans is that to use only the main gate at the Alfred street corner for all in-going traffic. Cars and pedestrians will all enter by this gate in the future and it is hoped to thus keep a better control of the crowds.

The president announced encouraging support from many business men and private citizens which will be acknowledged in due course.

The report on the last league meeting was read and adopted. The treasurer was authorized to draw a bond and pay the league's first assessment.
