#### BLEACHER STAND FOR THE BALL GAMES

Tenders Will Be Called for the Concession to Erect Stand at Fair Grounds.

The question of the erection of a bleacher stand at the fair grounds. for the baseball teams, was again before the civic property committee. at a meeting held on Thursday afternoon, and it was decided to call for tenders for a concession for the erection of a stand. The stand will be erected in accordance with the specifications provided by the city engineer, and it is proposed that the admission fee to the stand will be placed at 25 cents.

At a recent meeting of the committee, an offer was received from Ex.-Ald. Greenleaf, of Belleville, to erect a stand. He proposed to put up a stand of one section, to accommodate 240 people, with the idea of putting up another section and more if required.

Work Is Delayed. Prescott, May 15 .- Engineers inestigating the feasibility of the canalization of the St. Lawrence river were delayed in their work for a few days at Barnhart's Island in the Long Sault rapids, where difficulty was experienced in rock drilling recently. A shaft is to be sunk in the island and drilling will be carried on striking out horizontally from the shaft below the river bed. Depth and swiftness of the Long Sault rapids prohibited them from drilling vertically from pontoons, according to the regular custom.
