SUGGESTION

How To Prepare BRISKET CUTS for a Tasty Meal:

DIRECTIONS:-If the Brisket has a large amount of bone some of the latter may be removed to use for soup stock, or else for use as gravy for the warmed off meat. Cook the solid part of the meat until tender. Add a little celery and salt. Turn once during the cooking, which takes from five to six hours, and is best done in a double boiler or fireless cooker. Remove meat from the liquor and place in a shallow pan with skin side up. Put boiled potatoes around meat and brown all in a hot oven for about twenty minutes. Make gravy with the remaining liquid and serve in separately.


