Crop Conditions. Crop conditions generally continue favourable. Extremely hot weather has prevailed during the week in Alberta and Southwestern Saskatchewan, but rain has improved matters. In Ontario there has been a decided improvement in the crops during the week, and all grains promise a good yield. In Quebec the crops show good promise, but warm, dry weather is needed. In the Maritime Provinces all crops are progressing favourably. In British Columbia a good average hay crop is being gathered, but the Okanagan apple crop has been reduced to 60 per cent of the average.
