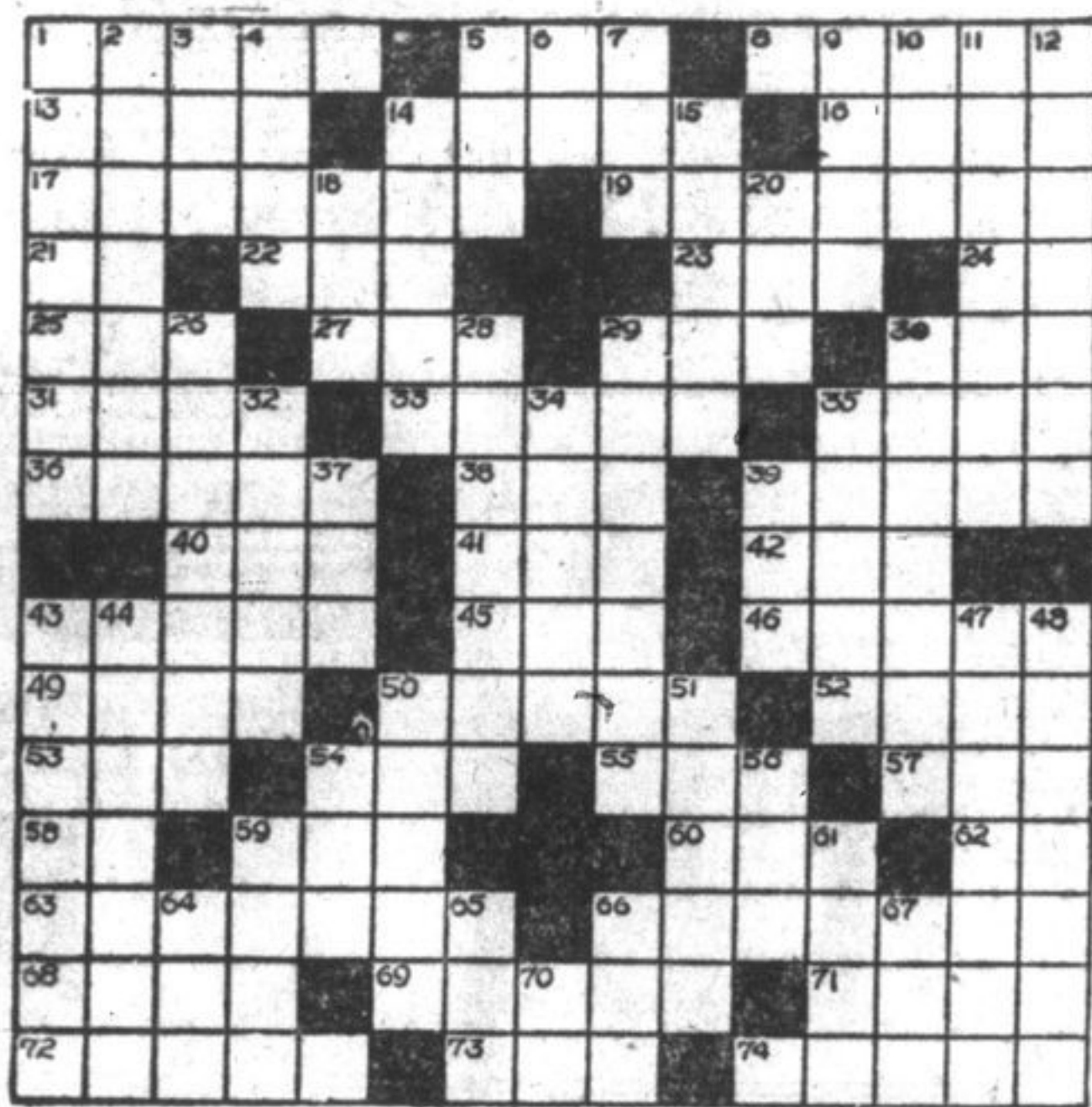

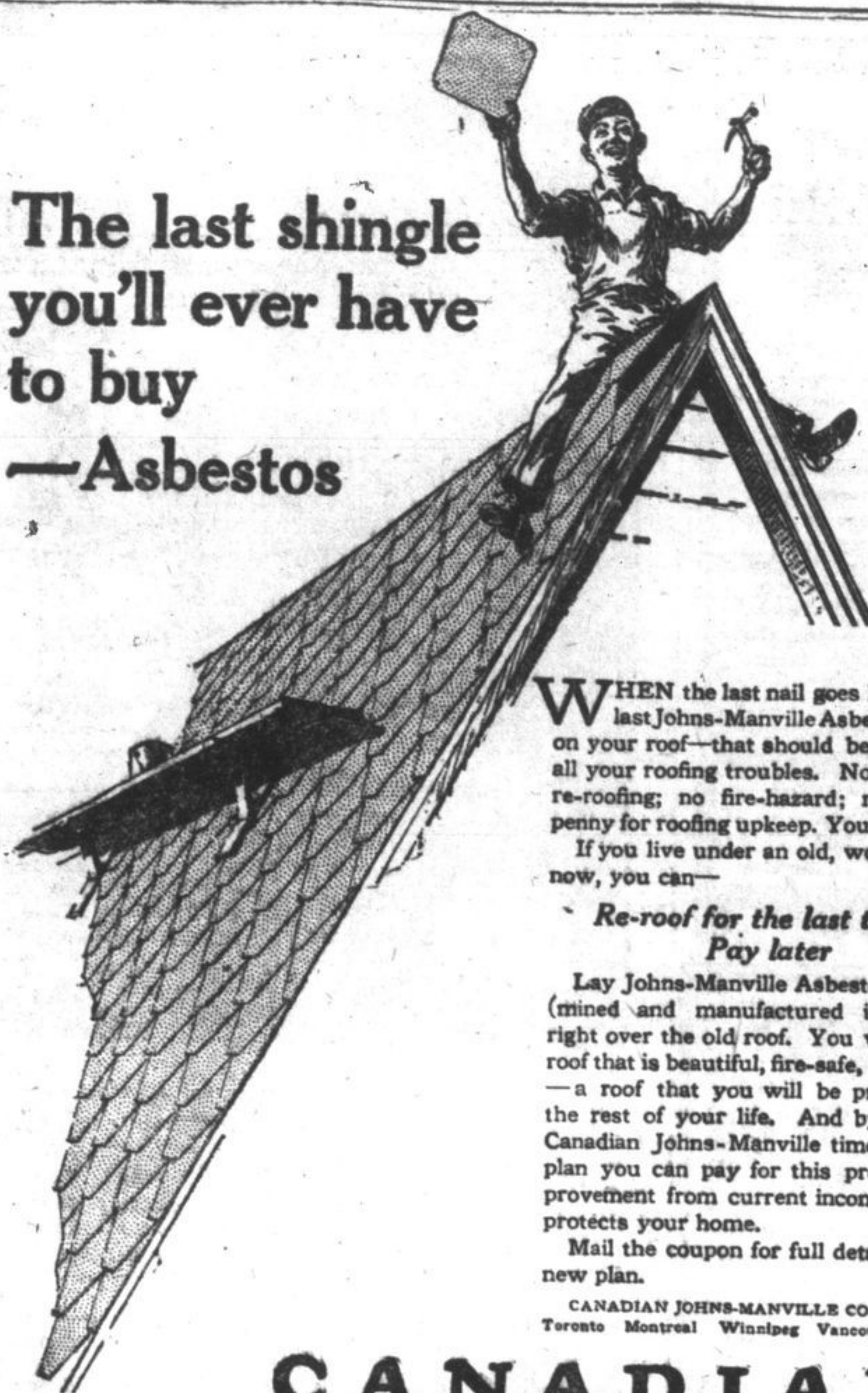
CROSS-WORD PUZZLE

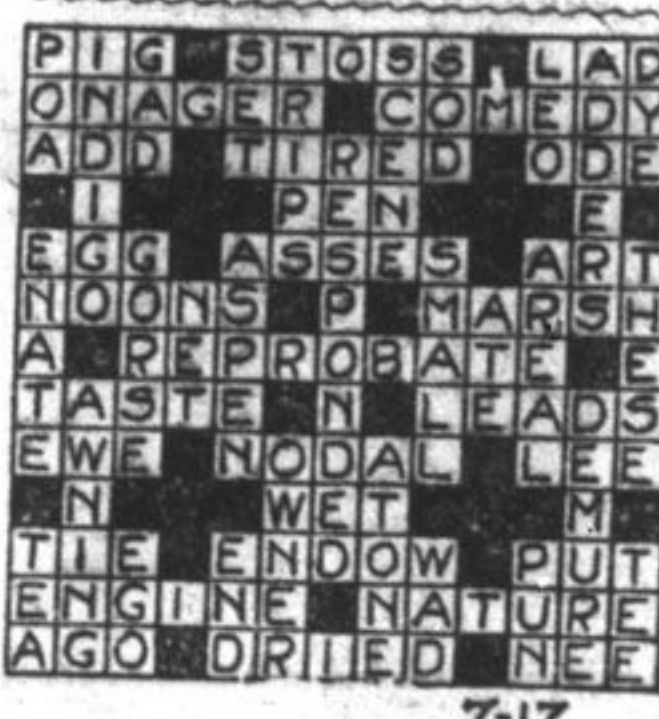

Judge Higgins of the Exeter county court in England, has ruled that a dog has no more right to the public highway than a wild animal. The point came up when a dog owner sued for damages after his canine had been killed by a motorist's machine. The judge held that the donkey and horse as beasts of burden, and the pig and chicken as food animals had road rights, but the dog belonged to the class of the lion or tiger. The decision will probably be contested by other interested dog owners. Women Invest in Racers.
