Steps are taken to crush communism in India in a raid on Cawnpore.

Forty-two mills on the dollar was the tax rate struck by the Orangeville council.

Miss Ella Diegel of Port Elgin was drowned in the harbor Thursday night while bathing.

Harry Wright, Midland, has been appointed license inspector for the county of Simcoe.

The Baldwin coal subsidy of fifty million dollars was passed by the British House of Commons.

The U.S. coal operators opens the door to miners for a further conference on the wage question.

Miners are panning \$25 per day per man from a new discovery on Telegraph Creek, Alaska.

Sir Henry Thornton states that the C.N.R. has no intention of building a large hotel in Vancouver, B.C.

The Alberta legislature has rescinded a recent resolution to sell Government House at Edmonton.

Glenstal castle, County Limerick, has been tendered to President Cosgrove of the Free State by Sir Charles Barrington as an official residence.

Along the border in the west much Canadian grain is smuggled across the line. More U.S. officers are to be appointed to guard the frontier.

W. F. O'Connor, K.C., has announced that in the coming Dominion elections he will be a candidate for Wright, Que., as an independent protectionist.

At New York the largest office building in the world, in point of floor space, is to be erected immediately on the New York Central Railroad's property.

For the first time in the history of Berlin University, all prizes awarded students on the basis of competitive, scientific thesis were awarded to women.

Late Jeffrey Jackson.
The death occurred in the city on Wednesday of Jeffrey Jackson, aged eighty-seven years. Deceased was formerly of the township of Kingston. The funeral took place on Thursday morning from S. S. Corbett's undertaking parlors to Catawagui cemetery. Rev. Canon W. F. Fitzgerald conducted the funeral service.

The death occurred at the House of Providence on Thursday of Peter Bishop, an old resident of Gananoque, at the age of 86 years. The remains were sent to Gananoque for burial by M. P. Keyes, undertaker.

UNITED CHURCH DRIVE
Will Be Undertaken From October 4th to 18th.

Toronto, Aug. 7.—Changes in pastorates of the United Church of Canada may be proceeded with soon although it was expected changes would be delayed until next meeting of the council. This alteration has been effected by the executive of the council which concluded an important meeting yesterday.

Transfer committees of the various conferences may function as early as September or October, when they meet. Settlement committees are also enabled to proceed at once with the stationing of pastors.

The executive decided that the commission to take up the permanent organization of the church in its four sections covering publications, education, funds and church department, shall assemble in Toronto in December. Offices for the moderator and secretary of the council will be opened at once. There was much discussion of the great spiritual and financial drive to be undertaken from October 4th to 18th.

Japan Honors Movie Stars.
Tokyo, Aug. 7.—That the Japanese are as enthusiastic about moving pictures and movie stars as are the film fans in America was recently evidenced by a prize contest for the most popular Japanese cinema player. The contest was conducted by the Miyako Shinbun of Tokyo, one of the leading amusement newspapers of the capital, and the winner, Miss Nobuko Satsuki, received 1,313,553 votes. Both male and female players were eligible. Miss Satsuki is noted for her "vamp" roles.
