Pittsburgh, Pa., Oct. 14.—Commissioner Landis to-day ordered postponement of the seventh and final world's series baseball game until to-morrow owing to rain. More than forty thousand people were in the stands waiting for the game to start when the postponement was announced at 2.35 o'clock.

Knocked Down and Robbed By a Thug at Belleville

Belleville, Oct. 14.—Struck on the jaw and manhandled by an unknown thug on Station Street, Tuesday, Norman W. Wickett, Toronto, salesman for the Canadian Marconi Co., was relieved of \$27 cash which he carried. The hold-up man then ran up Station Street towards the upper station and has not yet been apprehended.

Mr. Wickett was walking along Station Street at the time and was but one block from the well-lighted part of the street when from a shadow of a shade tree, a husky man grabbed him, threw him to the walk and relieved him of his money.

KILLED HIS WIFE. While Police Waited Outside His Door For Him.

Jersey City, N. J., Oct. 14.—While four police officers waited outside the door of his apartment until he could dress himself and let them in, George H. Winters, aged twenty-two, hacked his twenty-one-year-old wife, Margaret, to death with a butcher knife at 4 a. m. to-day, puncturing himself over the heart, puncturing the lung, City hospital officials said Winters would die.

CONRAD WILLIAMS, Mrs. Winters' son by a former marriage, cried in the crib while his step father killed his mother, who the police say, had just returned from a roadhouse with another man.

REPORTED KILLED. In An Italian Town By Pals of His Gang.

Montreal, Oct. 14.—Rumors in Montreal's underworld state that Nicolo Neri, who turned king's evidence in the famous Bank of Hochelaga holdup and murder in April, 1924, for which four men were hanged and two sent to penitentiary for life, has been killed in an Italian town by pals of his gang.

SCOURGE OF MANKIND. Montreal, Oct. 14.—That the social glass of liquor was a scourge to humanity and an arch-criminal was the declaration made in an address here by Rev. Father Lancelotti Minahan, pastor of St. Vincent de Paul church, Toronto.

Father Minahan added that liquor had caused the death of Robert Burns, Shakespeare and Richard Brinsley Sheridan.

SUICIDED OVER WHITE HAIR. London, Oct. 14.—Owing to the fact that her hair turned white through illness and an expert had declared it could not be dyed, Mrs. Mary Hobbs committed suicide last night. She was forty-nine years old and the wife of a London stockbroker.

ENDORSES COAL STRIKE. Atlantic City, N. J., Oct. 14.—The American Federation of Labor to-day unanimously voted to extend its complete endorsement and sympathy to the 155,000 members of the United Mine Workers now engaged in strike in the anthracite industry.

GRAIN QUALITY ABOVE AVERAGE FOR TEN YEARS

All Wheat Is Above Grade Mark and the Oat Crop Is Fine.

Ottawa, Oct. 14.—The quality of all wheat as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics is above the 10 year average, according to a monthly crop report issued.

The quality of the cereal crops at harvest time, as compared with a standard of 100, representing the average weight per measured bushel for the years 1915-24, is reported for all Canada as follows, the corresponding percentages for 1924 being given within brackets: Fall wheat 102 (100); spring wheat 101 (96); all wheat 101 (97); oats 101 (94); barley 98 (94); rye 97 (95); peas 95 (95); beans 95 (92); buckwheat 95 (100); mixed grains 101 (93); flaxseed 97 (91); corn for husking 92 (92). For wheat and oats the quality for 1925, as indicated by the figures given, is not only superior to that of last year, but is also better than in any years since 1920.

For the Prairie Provinces the quality of the principal cereals at harvest time is reported as follows: Manitoba, wheat 96 (94); oats 101 (95); barley 98 (98); rye 96 (99); Saskatchewan: wheat 102 (96); oats 98 (94); barley 97 (91); rye 97 (94). Alberta: fall wheat 98 (91); spring wheat 101 (95); all wheat 101 (95); oats 99 (89); barley 99 (92); rye 97 (92).

NOMINATION DAY IN 27 CONSTITUENCIES

Which Require a Period of Two Weeks Before Election Day. Ottawa, Oct. 14.—To-morrow is official nomination day in twenty-seven federal constituencies. By holding nominations in these constituencies one week before the official nomination in the majority of ridings, deferred elections are done away with and polling proceeds throughout Canada on October 23rd.

FRENCH BRED GELDING WON

The Historic Casarwick Stakes at Newmarket, England, Oct. 14.—Forseti, French-bred gelding, today won the historic Casarwick Stakes, carrying one thousand pounds sterling with extras, over a distance of two and a quarter miles. Forseti is owned by A. K. Macomber, United States sportsman. P. Ralli's Motley was second and S. Cohn's Confirmation third. Thirty-three horses started. Betting was 20 to 1 against Forseti.

FIRE DESTROYS MUCH ALCOHOL. Halifax, Oct. 14.—Twenty-five thousand gallons of alcohol, valued at \$250,000, were destroyed by a fire that ravaged the 35,000-gallon cargo of alcohol on board the steamship Hohenninden here yesterday.

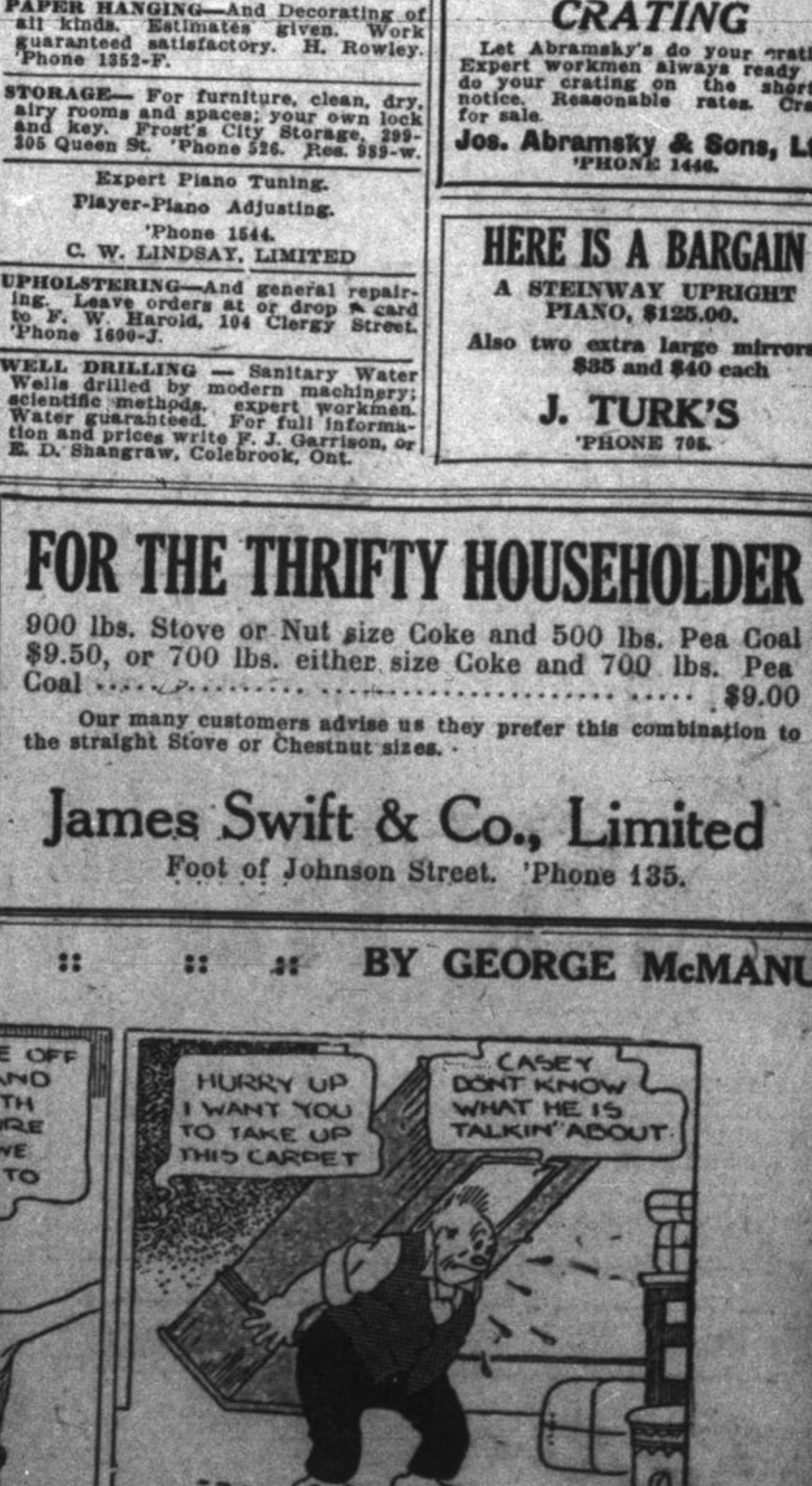
