SLEIGHS ARE IN USE NORTH OF QUEBEC CITY

Hunters and Trappers Are Using Snowshoes in the Forest.

Quebec, Oct. 22 .- North of Quebec and around the National Park in the Laurentides, hunters and trappers using the woods of the province are wearing snowshoes for their daily trips, it became known to-day, while all around the district, within a radius of forty-five miles, and with the exception of the section by the Montreal highway, winter vehicles are being used by inhabitants of those sections.

Deputy Minister of Roads Boulanger imparted this information, adding that, although there was in the neighborhood of two feet of snow on each side the Quebec-Murray Bay highway, this artery was still open to automobile traffic, although a lot of work and difficulty had been experienced in keeping it open.

The Matapedia Valley section had not recovered from its first snowstorm of ten days ago before it was visited by another blizzard that covered the whole countryside with a white mantle over the week-end, it was also stated, but, despite this, men are at work on the road, keeping it open for traffic.
