**WORKING OF THE O.T.A.**

Chief Justice Meredith Hopes Situation Will Improve.

Belleville, Oct. 28.—In the assizes here Chief Justice R. M. Meredith passed some frank comment on the working of the Ontario Temperance Act. His Lordship said he was pleased to announce that in this large section of the province only one case of a very serious character was down for trial. That was a very good record.

"But every place I go," said His Lordship, "60 per cent. of those in jails are persons who have been convicted on O.T.A. charges. Here it is the same, there being six persons in the county jail. This is not a satisfactory state of affairs, to have healthy men in jail who should be earning a livelihood. It is to be hoped recent legislation or other legislation will correct this situation."
