FINE WEATHER FOR KINGSTON'S ELECTION

The Workers Expected That Record Vote Would Be Polled.

To-night's the night. The story of the battle of the ballots will be known to-night, following the closing of the polls at 6 o'clock.

The last gun in the way of speeches, has been fired, the canvassing for votes has also been finished, and now all that remains is the verdict of the electors.

With both political parties working hard, and both sides confident of victory, Election Day was marked by great activity on the part of the supporters of Mr. J. M. Campbell, the Liberal candidate, and Dr. A. E. Ross, the Conservative candidate, and although the voting was rather slow up till noon, the votes were recorded in very large numbers after the noon hour, and on during the afternoon, and it was expected that a record vote would be polled.

The Weather Man smiled on the electors, too. Following the rain on Wednesday Old Sol came out in all his glory Thursday morning, and while the air was cool it was quite pleasant. There was great activity at all the polling booths.

There are 14,471 names on the voters' list for Kingston and 699 from Portsmouth.
