Moscow, Oct. 39 .- Another severe blow was aimed at private traders in Soviet Russia when M. Jerjinsky, head of the Supreme Economic Council, acting for the council and the Ukrainian Government, directed that numerous officials of the State and co-operative organizations engaged in the sale of textiles should be placed on trial.

The Government charges these private traders with accumulating huge stocks of cotton goods from the State organizations for re-sale at exorbitant prices.
