shoe plant will remain when the  
wreckers are through. The machin-

Safe, junk dealer, here. He is  
breaking some of the old machinery  
for junk and transshipping the re-  
mainder which may be used as ma-  
chinery again. This marks the pass-  
ing of a one time thriving industry  
which came to Belleville more than  
twenty years ago, but which has  
been closed for more than half that  
time.
