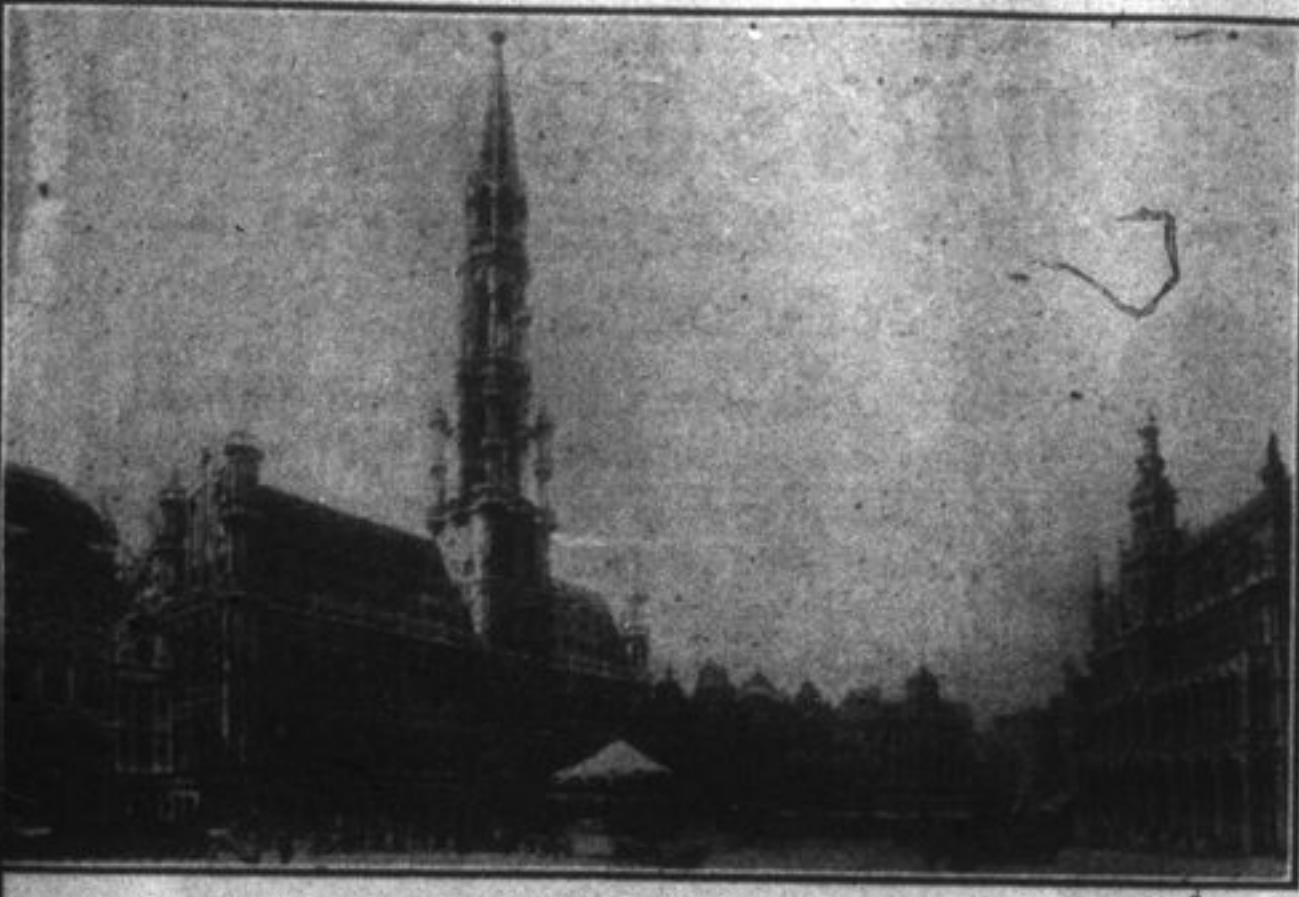

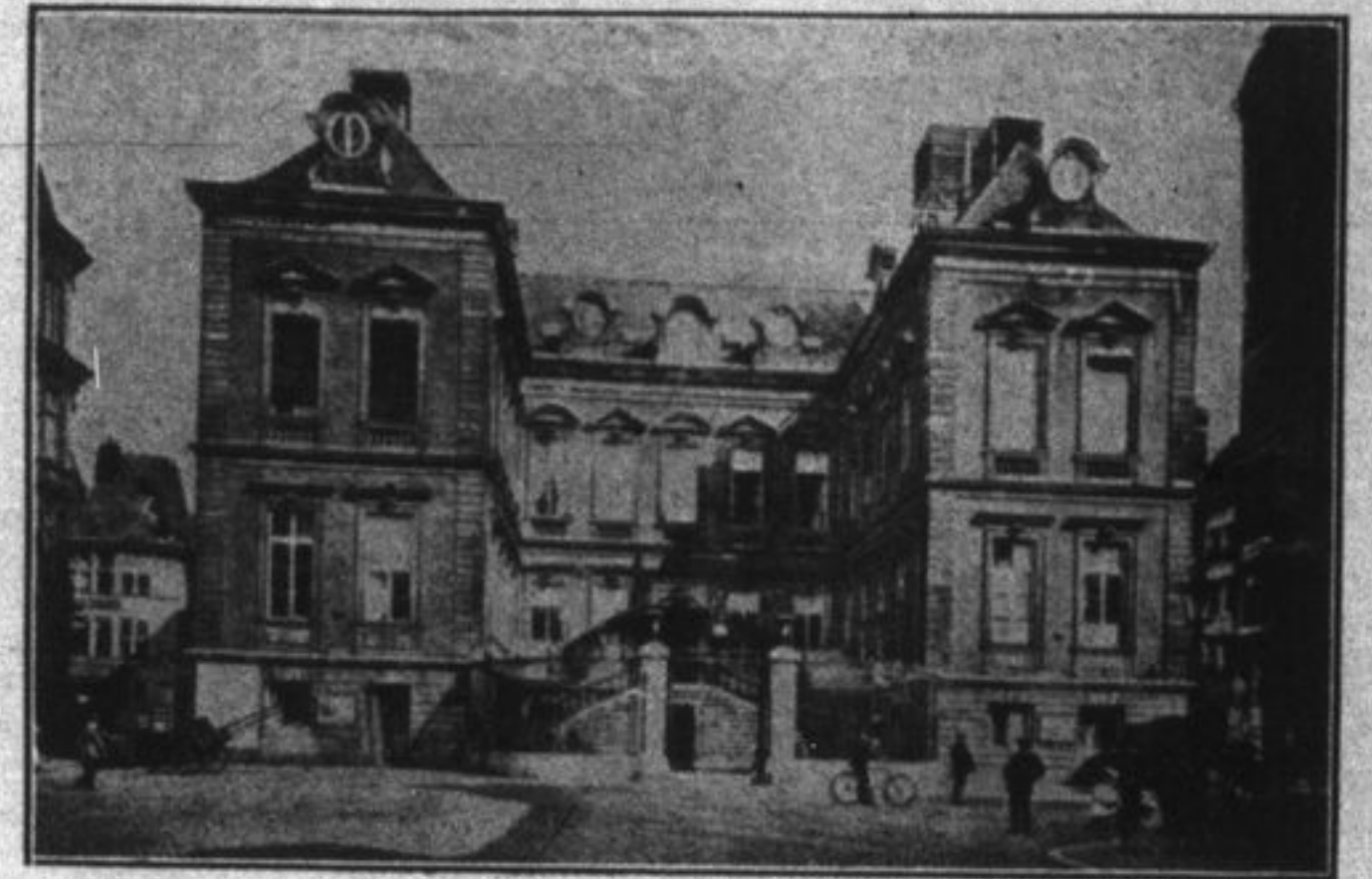
WHERE EDITH CAVELL WAS SHOT

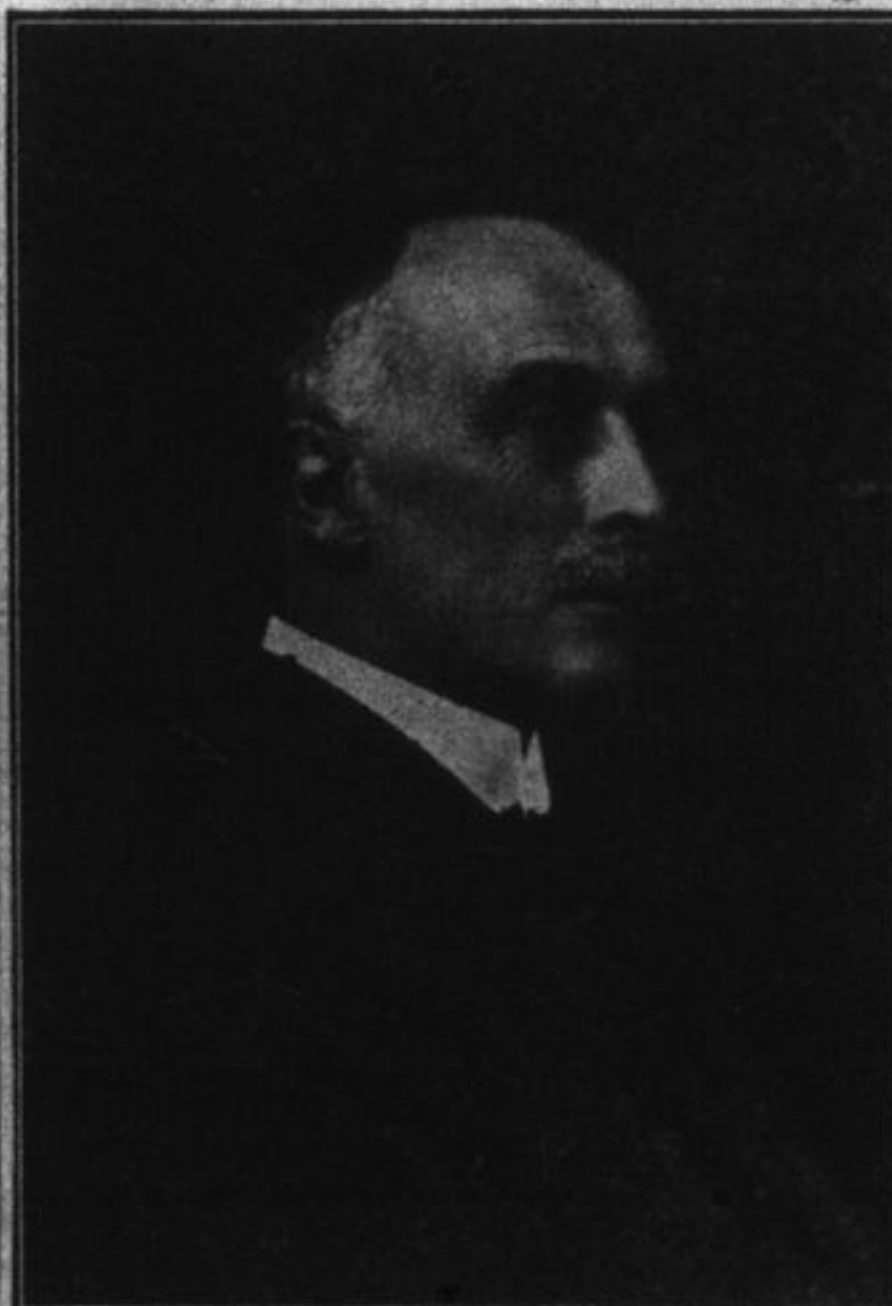

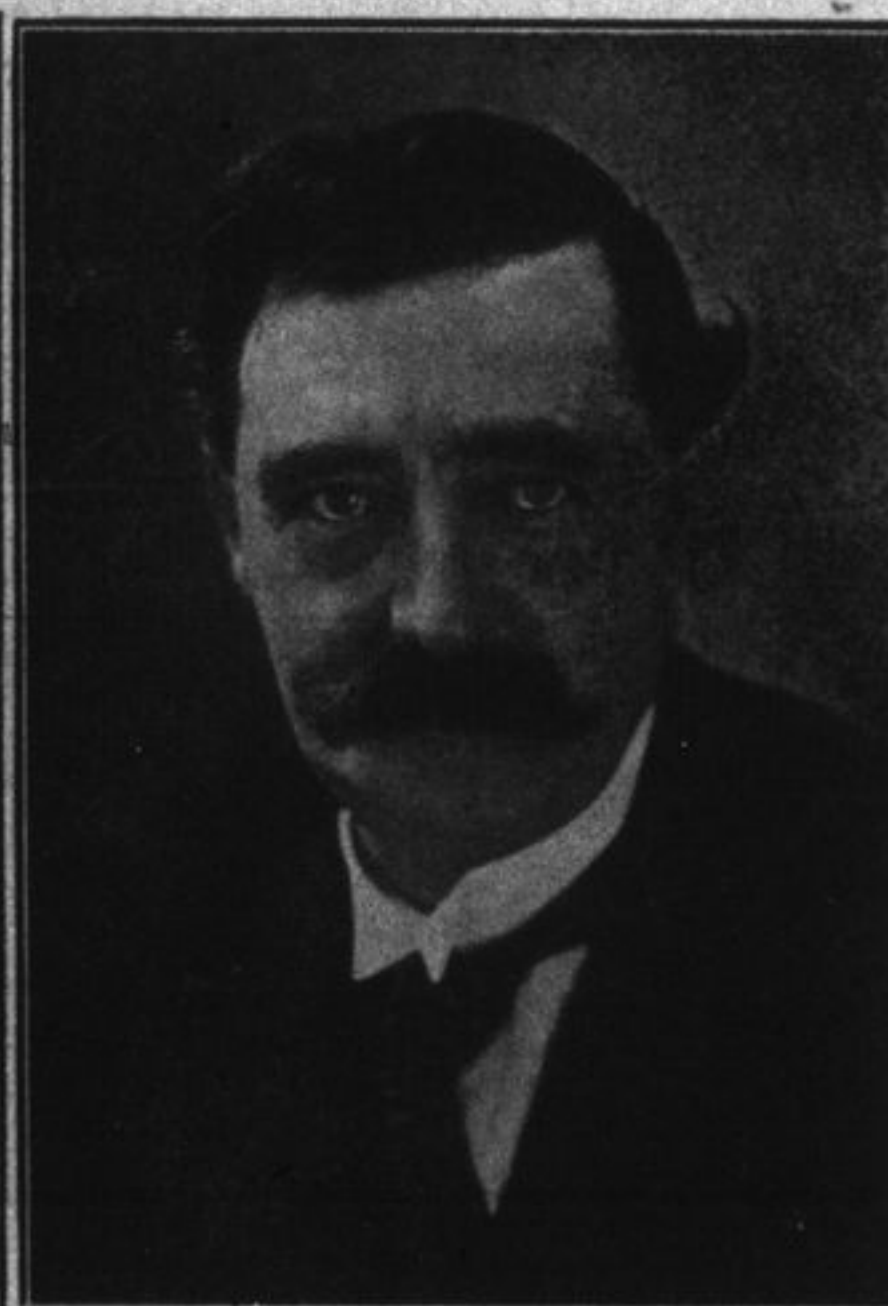

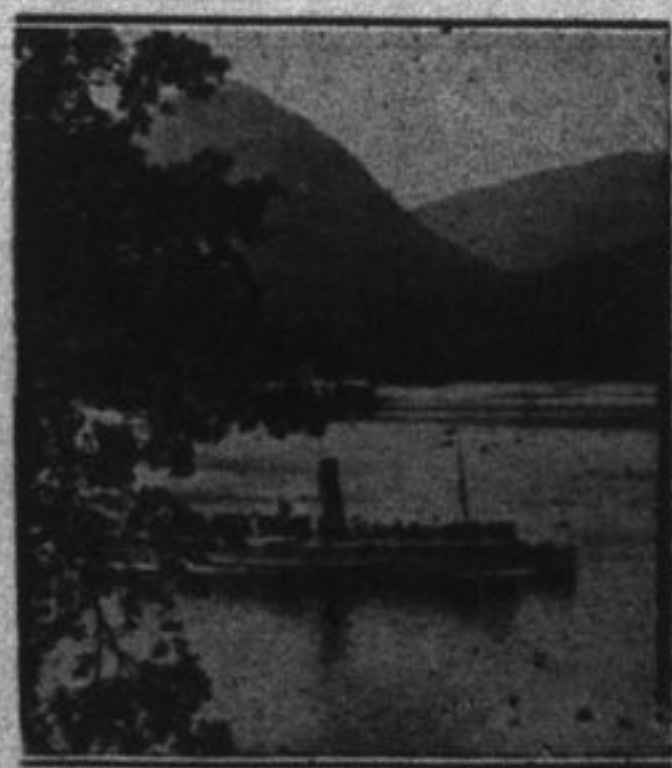
