Quebec, Dec. 26 .- Field-Marshal Lord Allenby, accompanied by Lady Allenby, will visit Quebec on Saturday, March 27th, leaving on Sunday afternoon for Halifax. The distinguished visitors arrive at Victoria B.C., on the fifth of the same month. The tour is under the auspices of the National Council of Education, and at the various cities of the Dominion Viscount Allenby will give addresses on "Imperial Unity," and possibly also on the Palestine campaign.

Missions Act to Save Them From

London, Dec. 26 .- "Christian girls are being bought at \$5 per head by the missions to save them from the horrors of becoming prisoners in Turkish harems. Thirty thousand girls at least are captive," states tev. S. S. W. Gently-Cackett, secretary of the Bible Lands Missions Society, who has returned to London from Syria. He added: "Girls are branded on the face to stamp them their owners if they escape."

Girls about fourteen years old are taken into Turkish harems, and younger girls are farmed out to Arabs and Kurds to be kept until they reach that age, when they are sold to Turks, he said.

In dismissing Bishop Fallon's application Charles Garrow Master, of the Supreme Court, says there is no right to a set off until the set off has been investigated. He finds that the deposit of the cheque was the payment of a just debt.
