The Forecasting of the Weather

"What are the weather probs. for tomorrow?" Is a question which is asked all over Canada every day in the year.

To find out how the Meteorological Office at Toronto was able to send out information on weather conditions, a representative to The British Whig visited the observatory at Queen's University which is one of the sixty odd substations of the Canadian Meteorological Service.

There are four thermometers placed outdoors on the University campus in special containers. These record the highest temperature, the lowest temperature and the humidity for the preceding twelve hours.

In a special room in Ontario Hall is situated the various delicate instruments for measuring the velocity and direction of the wind, the rainfall and the pressure.

When these facts are gathered at Kingston and at the sixty odd other stations they are telegraphed to Toronto at eight in the morning and at eight in the evening.

At the Meteorological Office in Toronto all the reports are considered and from the information supplied a map is prepared showing the centres of high and low pressure.

Areas of high and low pressure travel across the continent from west to east and they are practically always moving.

In connection with the observatory, there is a signal station for warning shipping when a storm is expected from what direction it is expected.

Up to a velocity of about thirty miles an hour winds are not considered dangerous but above that rate they constitute a menace in proportion to the rate they are travelling.
