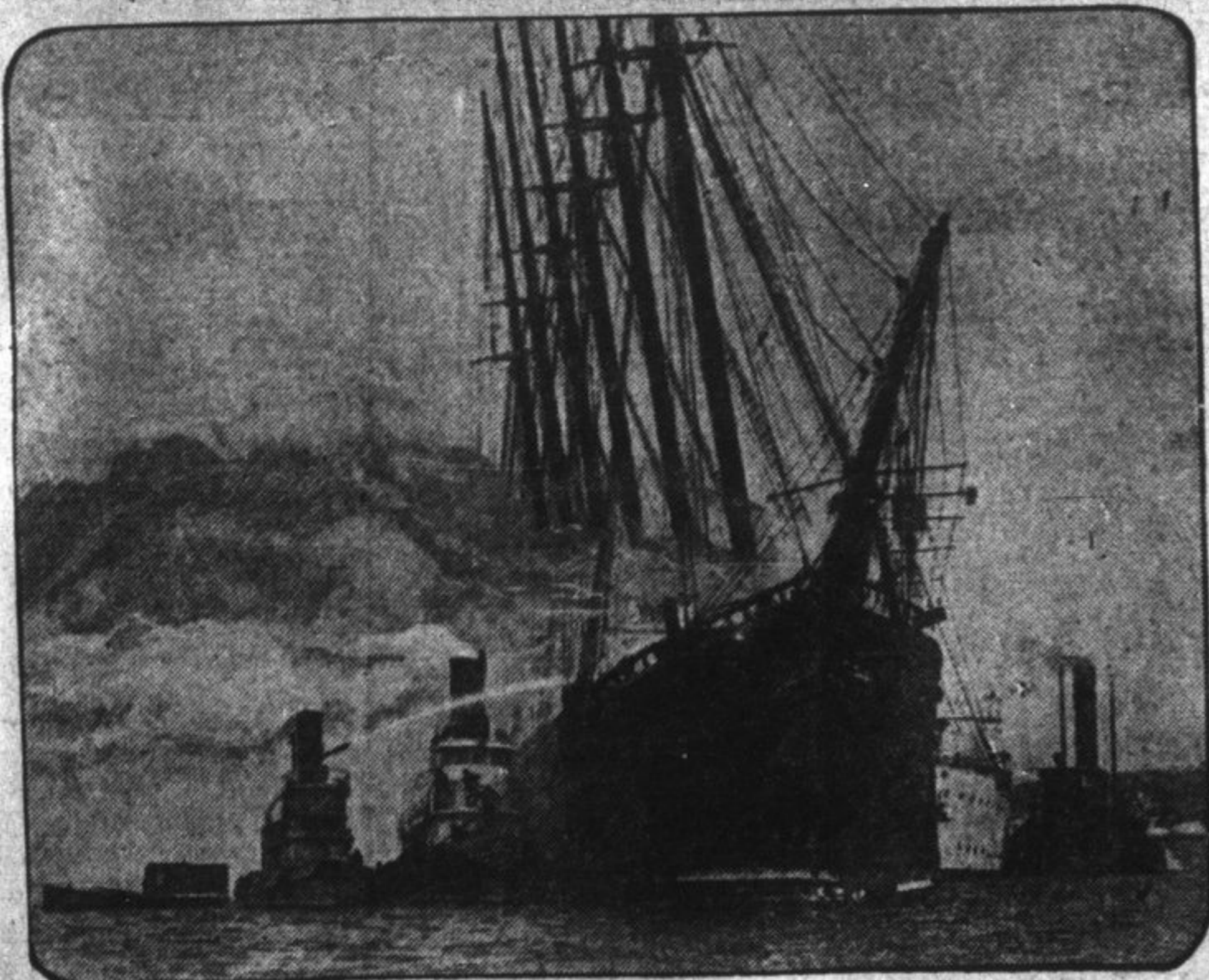


LAST SIX-MASTED SCHOONER BURNED

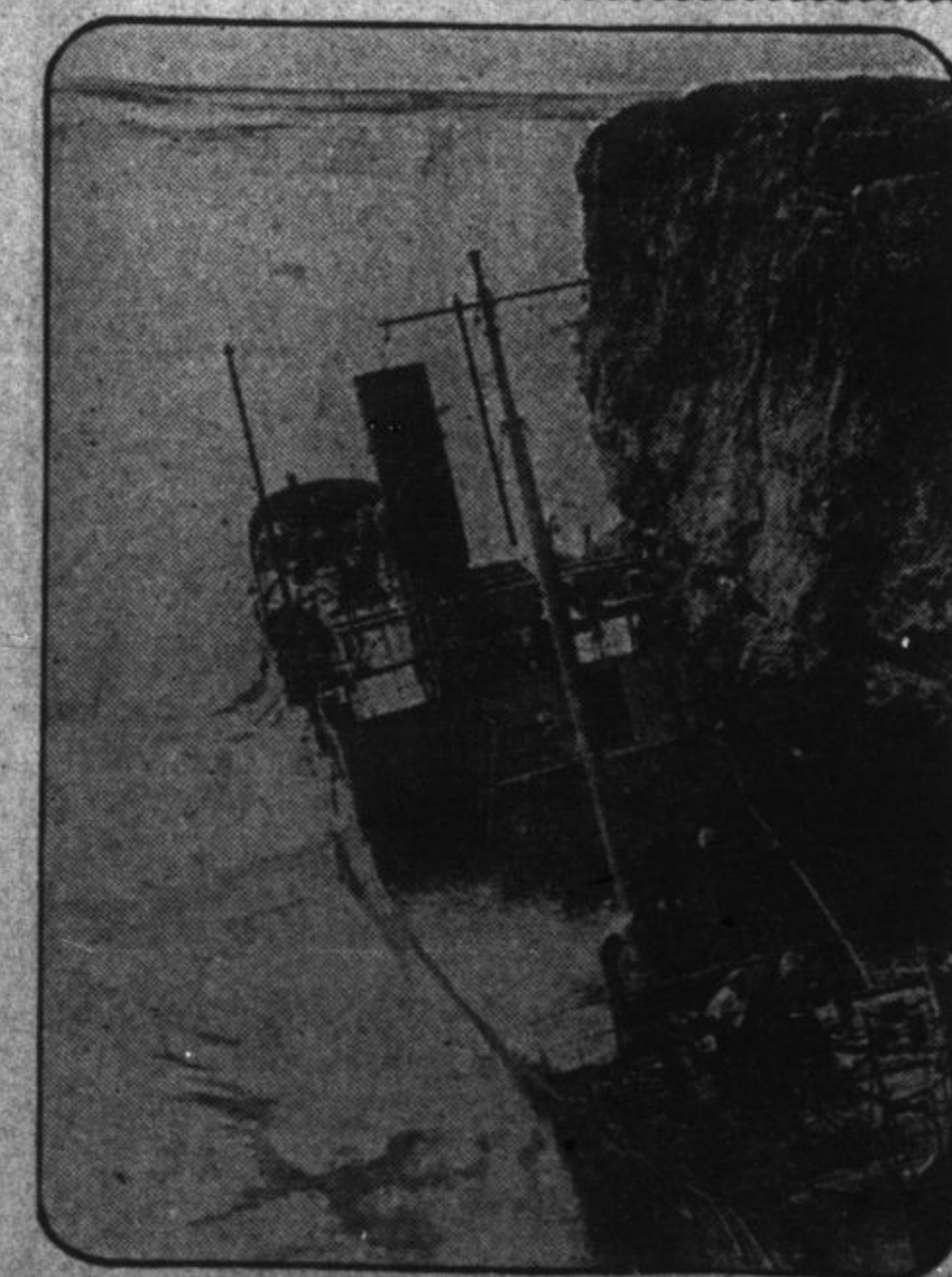
