BUILDING LCCOMOTIVE FOR ALBERTA ROAD

Mr. Nathaniel Marshall of Alberta Government Railway Department Here.

Canadian Locomotive Works eceived another order from the rta Government's Department of Raffways and Telephones, for a locomotive to be used on the Alberta and Great Waterways Railway, which is owned and operated by the Government of Alberta. It has been learned from Mr. Nathaniel Marshall, of the Alberta Department of Railways, who arrived in the city on Monday, and who is representing the Alberta Department in the building of the locomotive that the Alberta Government already has three of the kind built in Kingston, in operation, and they have proven to be a sucon the northern lines owned by Government, where the snow is exceptionally deep and where a special locomotive is required.

The locomotive is of the fivewheeled coupled type, and will take eight weeks to build. The local works will put every effort to have the order completed as soon as possible, and it was intimated by Mr. Marshall that there was a possibility of delivery at an earlier date. He thought that it might be possible to have it eted in six weeks. Asked if he thought that the Alberta Government would require any more for use on these lines, he declined to say, but thought that the Government intended to go ahead with an aggressive railway programme, and such a thing was possible. Mr. Marshall described the new locomotive as "huge," and hinted that it was very modern in every detail. Although some work was done before Mr. Marshall arrived ,nothing resembling building the engine has been attempted yet. Work was started Thursday morning on the boiler, and work on some of the parts was commenced as soon as the Alberta representative arrived in the city to inspect them.

It has taken some time to gather together all the material to be used the locomotive, but the last connment has arrived at the local lant, and it is thought that more men will be taken on, now that all the material is here. The operations have been held up for some time, due to this fact, and it is expected that the work will go ahead imme-

Marshall, who is here in the erests of the Alberta Government, as had twenty years' experience ng this line, and has been on such missions on previous occasions for the Government. His position is a very responsible one and he is required to be constantly on the job. He is a boiler expert, and it is under his special supervision that the boiler is being constructed.

It has been well known for some fime that it has been the intention of the British Columbia and Alberta Governments to join the two lines of the Pacific Great Eastern and to push the line up into the Peace River country. It is because of this that Mr. Marshall is very optimistic in One Woman, With Two Babies, regard to the future of the railways in Alberta, which have had a very osperous year.
