OBITUARY

Late Mrs. Edwin Beaupre. Annethe Moffatt, aged ninety-five years, widow of the late Edwin Beaupre, passed away at the Hotel Dieu on Thursday after a short illness. The deceased was born at Niagara-on-the-Lake and came to Kingston in 1851, living in Portmouth, where she was very well known and highly regarded. She was a Roman Catholic in religion and a prominent worker in the societies connected with the Church of the Good Thief, Portmouth.

The deceased is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Powers, Whiting, Indiana; Mrs. J. Halden, Portmouth; Mrs. G. Sullivan, Kingston; five sons, Edward, Albany, N.Y.; William, Seattle, Wash.; Frank, Detroit, Mich.; Peter, Portmouth, and Edwin, Kingston; thirty-two grandchildren and eighteen great-grandchildren. The husband of the deceased was tax collector in the village of Portmouth for thirty-two years.

The funeral will take place on Monday morning from her son's residence, Portmouth, to the Church of the Good Thief, where a solemn requiem mass will be sung.

Hours Interesting Letter From Rev. Norman Taylor of Mexico. The monthly meeting was held on Wednesday, Jan. 20th. The newly elected President, Mrs. Duncan Robertson, was in the chair, and conducted the devotional exercises, saying a few words on New Year's resolutions and the need for real work. Membership does not mean simply paying a fee and attending a few meetings; it should signify a real interest and a readiness to help.

Excellent reports were given by the different secretaries, after which a letter from Rev. Norman Taylor in Mexico under the Board of the American Presbyterian church. This is a branch of the world's missionary work, almost unknown to Canadians, and all listened with great interest to the vivid picture drawn by Mr. Taylor. The likeness between conditions in Mexico and those in Palestine during the lifetime of our Lord is very striking, but the people are sunk in ignorance and superstition, the Holy Name being given to children and even to sailors to ward off evil and bring good luck.

The meeting closed with the Hymn and the Lord's Prayer in unison.
