HINTS FOR THE MOTORIST. ALBERT L. CLOUGH. Testing Valves For Perfect Seating.

IT APPEARS that many motorists, who grind their engine valves themselves are unfamiliar with the methods of verifying the correctness of their work. While it is fairly safe to assume that if, after grinding is completed, both the valve face and the valve seat show corresponding, perfectly continuous and uniform bright rings as contact surfaces, seating will be tight, the following procedure may be resorted to as a further proof of the accuracy of the work.

GENERATOR FIELD-FUSE BLOWS. THERE GOES ANOTHER FUSE!!!

W. S. asks: What causes the fuse on the top of my generator to burn out? Yesterday, I noticed there was no current going to my battery and found this fuse blown out, but when I put my spare one in its place, this also burned out, so that I am now running without the battery being charged.

Answers: This always happens when the generator builds up its voltage and for some reason is prevented from delivering its normal output of current to the battery and lights. One may say that when the battery will not take its usual current, too much current is forced through the generator field windings and burns out the fuse.

GLYCERINE-ALCOHOL ANTI-FREEZE. Mrs. C. L. asks: In the use of glycerine and alcohol, as anti-freeze, in the cooling system of my sedan, how much of each ingredient should be employed and where can I get them?

Answers: Glycerine and denatured alcohol are generally used in equal proportions and water is always added. To make a mixture that will protect against freezing down to about nine degrees above zero F. the following percentages by measure of the three ingredients are recommended: Glycerine 15, alcohol 15 and water 70.

Answers: The amount of glycerine and alcohol used in the mixture will depend upon the temperature at which you are operating. For example, for a mixture to be used in a car which will be operated in a climate where the temperature is likely to fall below zero, a mixture of five parts glycerine, five parts alcohol and fourteen parts of water will make a solution that will give you protection down to ten degrees below zero.

SQUEAK IN STEERING COLUMN. WONDER HOW GLYCERINE AND ALCOHOL GET INSIDE!

F. A. E. writes: When I have to turn the steering wheel of my coach fast and hard, as when I am taking out of close quarters, I sometimes hear a sharp squeak, which I cannot locate. As I keep all joints in the steering gear well greased and as the wheel turns easily, I cannot see where the squeak comes from, but it is evidently connected with the steering apparatus.

Answers: Probably the inside of the steering post lacks oil. Try squirting a little thin oil into the hole, which you will find in the hub of the steering wheel, under the wheel itself. This will work down and lubricate the tube within the column and should stop this squeaking.
