AWARDED \$10 PRIZE

For Splendid First Aid Work Last Year. Alexandria Bay, N.Y., Feb. 16.—George Brown, aged fourteen, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Brown, was recently awarded a \$10 gold piece by the committee on first aid award of the junior first aid legion sponsored by Bauer & Black, Chicago.

While fishing for bullheads in a marsh near Wellesley Island with Joe Scott, George was afforded an opportunity to apply his first aid knowledge which he had learned in the Boy Scouts. Joe had become entangled with a hook that entered and cut an artery. Since they were nearly three miles from home and in a skiff it was necessary to do something at once to stop the flow of blood. Remembering his training George made a tourniquet and applied it over the artery until the blood ceased to flow. Securing it he rowed home where the injury was attended by Dr. L. L. Samsom of this village. George reported the incident to the first aid legion with a statement from the doctor and he was entered in the list of contestants for an award. In the October 10th issue of the Saturday Evening Post George's act was used in an advertisement of Bauer & Black.

Local Labor Situation

Forty-three married men received relief work at the local office of the Government Employment-Service last week. The civic quarry has been operated all winter, and about twelve men are constantly employed in this work.

On Monday, forty applied for work and nineteen received casual labor, three were placed on farms, three were placed locally, and one domestic received a position.

A New Disease

Berlin, Feb. 16.—"Match-box inflammation" is the name given a newly diagnosed skin disease. Physicians of the University of Berlin clinic say it is caused by carrying boxes of matches in trousers pockets. Hundreds of cases of what appeared to be eczema on the thighs of men led to an investigation. It was found that the phosphorus sandpaper on the sides of the match boxes vaporized under the heat of the body and penetrated the skin.
