REFUSED TO PAY FOR HIS MOTHER'S KEEP

Man Was Sent to Jall for Ten Days-Charge Against Brother Enlarged.

For refusing to pay \$1 per week for the maintenance of his mother. at the Home for the Aged, a middleaged man, was on Wednesday morning sentenced by Magistrate Farrell to serve ten days in the county jail. The accused was forty weeks in arrears. His excuse to the magistrate was that he had sickness in the family, and could not pay, and that he had been out of work.

The evidence offered by the prosecution showed that he was 108 weeks

in arrears in his payments. To his counsel, George Laturney, he stated that he was unable to pay. He had a family of five to keep, which included his wife, two children and his father-in-law. Counsel submitted a certificate from a local doctor, showing that the accused was not in good health.

Questioned by the magistrate, the accused admitted having purchased a house for \$900, and stated that he had \$300 to pay on it. He had been paying \$100 each fall on the property, also the taxes amounting to \$27, and interest, \$13.


