## PETER SMITH'S TERM EXPIRES IN MAY, 1927

Provincial Treasurer Has Still About Fifteen Months to Serve.

Peter Smith was brought to the penitentiary on Thursday, November 13th, 1924. According to the rules a three-year sentence means that, with time allowed off for good behavior, a prisoner must serve two years, five months and twenty-two days. During the first six months of the sentence no time is allowed but for the next year, six days month is allowed and for the remaining months the amount of rebate is ten days per month.

It had been expected that Peter Smith might have been given a parole around Christmas time, but it is announced that the Department of Juswas willing to act, providing the provincial government was willing.
