CHEER UP! CANADA!

The Stirring Story of Our National Prosperity Proved by Increased Production and Realization of Resources —All Pointing to a Great 1926.

Canada is a going concern; a going-on, not a going-up one. What are the evidences of the claim? Progress has been defined as "where flow exceeds ebb."

There are a few special proofs: The value of the seven principal crops (wheat, oats, barley, rye, flax, corn and hay) shows a phenomenal increase in the last 25 years.

Canada's trade in 1925 (Calendar year) reached \$2,161,000,000, \$285,000,000 more than in 1924; imports increasing by \$82,000,000, and exports by \$213,000,000.

Canada's annual production, in 1925, of crops, dairy, fisheries, forests, mines, fruits, etc., exceeded two and a quarter billion dollars.

Canada's meat exports had an approximate increase of \$12,000,000 in the past twelve months. Notable gains have been made in the exportation of fresh beef, mutton and lamb.

Canada's mining production reached a high-water mark in 1925 of \$225,440,000—a substantial increase.

The three prairie provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta had a field crop production in 1925 of \$648,688,000, at an average of \$2,540 for every occupied farm.

Canada now ranks third among the gold-producing countries in the world. She has more of the mineral-bearing pre-Cambrian strata exposed than all the other countries of the world combined.

The Port of Montreal created a new record in 1925 in a net tonnage of 4,744,798 of 1,940 trans-Atlantic vessels, compared with 955 vessels and 3,597,747 tons in 1924.

Northern Ontario Gold Mines output, Jan.-Sept., 1925, of \$22,411,173, was 23.3 per cent. higher than in the same period of 1924.

Canada ranks seventh in the list of world countries in wealth, estimated at over \$2 billion dollars, or

\$2,500 per capita, exceeding Australia and Holland. Canada's foreign trade has made an astonishing recovery. The returns for December, 1925, completed the figures for much the best year since the end of the war boom, and making allowance for the abnormal conditions which then prevailed, it is the best trade year the country has ever had.

There was an increase in imports of \$32,127,715 over 1924, mainly in the following divisions: Agricultural and vegetable products, \$19,986,150; animal products, \$4,721,182; fibres and textiles, \$13,875,983; iron and its products, \$28,592,605.

Motor vehicles registered in Canada have increased from 49,547 in 1914 to 650,231 in 1924, or nearly ten times as many, and over 700,000 in 1925.

Canada's largest railway yards in world operated by one concern—C.P.R. at Winnipeg (258 miles of track).

Canada has longest and greatest publicly-owned railway system in the world—Canadian National, 23,000 miles.

Canada has world's longest unfenced boundary line.
