Brockton, Mass., Feb. 25.—Anthony Bimba, Lithuanian editor and lecturer of Brookline, whose utterances in denial of the existence of God have stirred a controversy on the right of "free speech" that has swept New England and have brought him to trial on charges of blasphemy and sedition, had his day in Plymouth district court yesterday, with Judge C. Carroll King presiding.

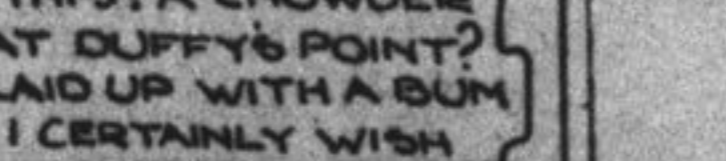

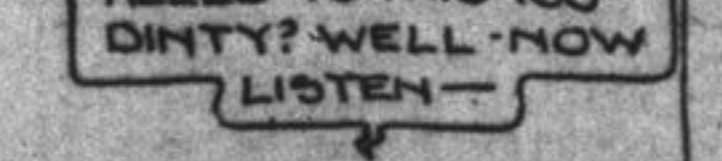
