HAD CONFERENCE WITH HON. LINCOLN GOLDIE

H. C. Nickle and Fraser Armstrong on Deputation Over Hospital Grants.

H. C. Nickle, chairman of the Board of Governors, and Fraser Armstrong, superintendent of the Kingston General Hospital, returned from Toronto on Friday morning after attending a conference with the Hon, Lincoln Goldie, provincial secretary for the Province of Ontario.

When interviewed by a representative of the Whig on Friday morning they stated that it was submitted that owing to the high standard of treatment, greater efficiency equipment, increased demands for service, and administration and medical science, the cost on the Ontario per patient day was steadily increasing. In 1920, the average cost per day was \$2.99, in 1922, \$3.07, and in 1925, \$3.27, and without lowering the standard of the hospital, even with the most rigid economies, it was impossible to get costs on the average below this amount. The amount which the hospital could co!lect for indigent patients is by no means sufficient to cover the cost. At the present time, under the act, hospitals can collect for the maintenance of these indigent or public patients only \$1.50 per day from the municipality, and 50 cents per day (up to 120 days and 10c. thereafter) from the Government. Unless therefore, hospitals are to give inferior service, the loss sustained by insufficient payment by State and municipality to cover the maintenance of public patients must be obtained by

substantial donations or by making profits from paying patients. This last method has been manifestly unfair especially to the patients of moderate means, who have to struggle enough to pay the cost of his own treatment without having in the time of his sickness to also help pay the cost of indigents, which costs should be covered by a general levy on the municipality or the province. It was pointed out that if the actual cost of maintenance of indigents or public patients was paid, hospitals would not be obliged to charge as ligh rates for the rooms for private
