KINGSTON BETTER OFF THAN MOST PLACES

Employment Conditions Here Are the Best for Several Winters.

W. A. Stroud, the local representative of the Ontario Government Employment Bureau, when asked by a representative of the Whig about labor conditions in Kingston, stated that the weekly report for the province shows that Kingston is a great deal better off than any other place.

Mr. Stroud stated that on account of there being considerable building work going on this winter, a large number of mechanics have been given employment. It is safe to say that the majority of the mechanics in Kingston have had considerable work during the entire winter.

When speaking about unskilled labor, Mr. Stroud stated that while there were a number of men in this class out of work the number was not nearly as large as it has been in previous years.

AN ELGINBURG HOME DESTROYED BY FIRE

Overheated Stove Caused Serious Loss at Albert Stover's on Saturday.

A fire which destroyed the house and burned half the furniture in it, broke out in the home of Albert Stover, Elginburg, on Saturday morning. The fire was discovered about 10 o'clock and residents of the place rushed to the burning house and did their best to overcome the flames but it was of no use.

The Stovers were in Kingston but before they had left they put in a good coal fire and had evidently left the drafts on. The fire became so hot that the flooring in front of the stove took fire, and the flames spread rapidly, going up into the ceiling. With so many of the residents of the village in the city, it being Saturday morning, there were few left to fight the fire.

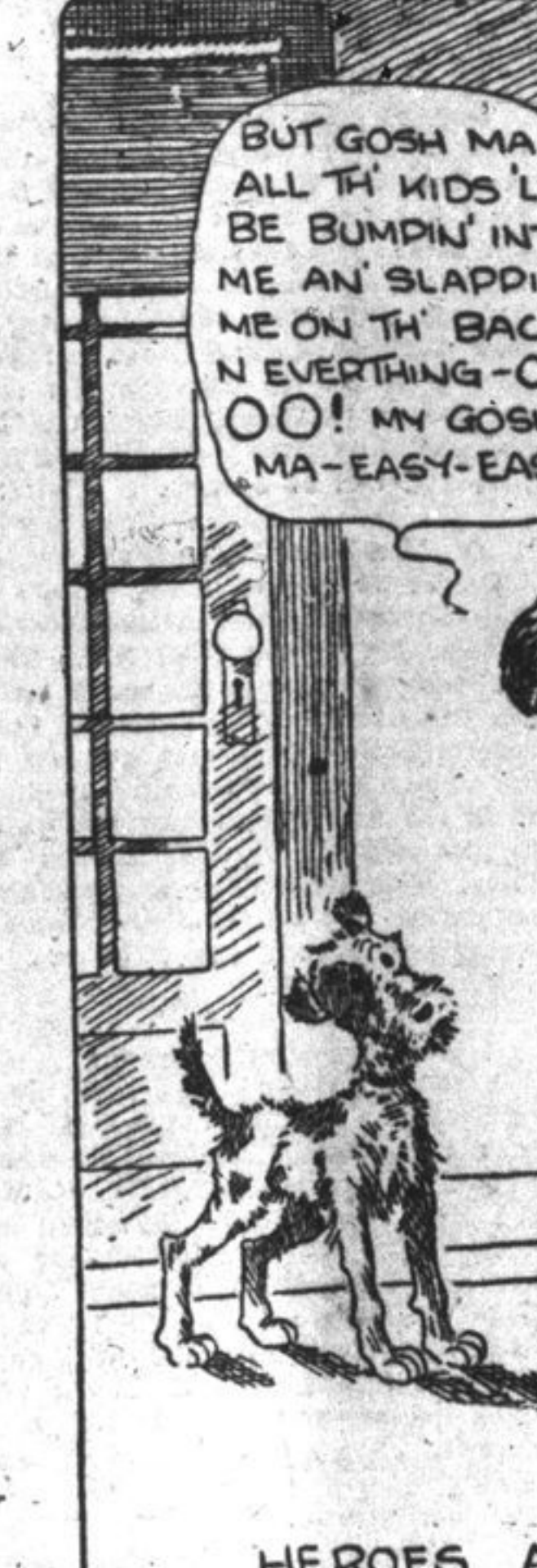
