In view of the fact that on March the Bell Telephone Company will lebrate the fiftieth-anniversary of ts birth it is interesting to note the advances which have been made by

the company in Kingston. As far as The Whig can learn, the Bell Telephone was first introduced nto lingston in the late seventies, A life-long resident of Kingston, when speaking to a representative of The Whig, stated that he could well remember when the first phone was installed. The first telephone exchange was located on Ontario street, next to the Frontenac Hotel. For years the company remained there. The first manager was a man the name of Freeman, and he was followed by A. T. Smith, who at the piresent time is located in Toronto. Henry Snelling was the local manager for years, and was in charge of the local office when the company moved to the present building now

ere are many subscribers at the present time who have been constant users for over forty years. The Canadian National Railway office and telegraph offices have retained the same numbers, namely 99 and 1. during all these years. The two local vspapers have never changed numbers, Standard business e 29, and editorial department , and British Whig, business office, 243. The Whig editorial department was 229 up until a few years ago, when a change was made. The firm of A. Chown & Co. has been a subscriber for over forty years and have had the same number, 71.
