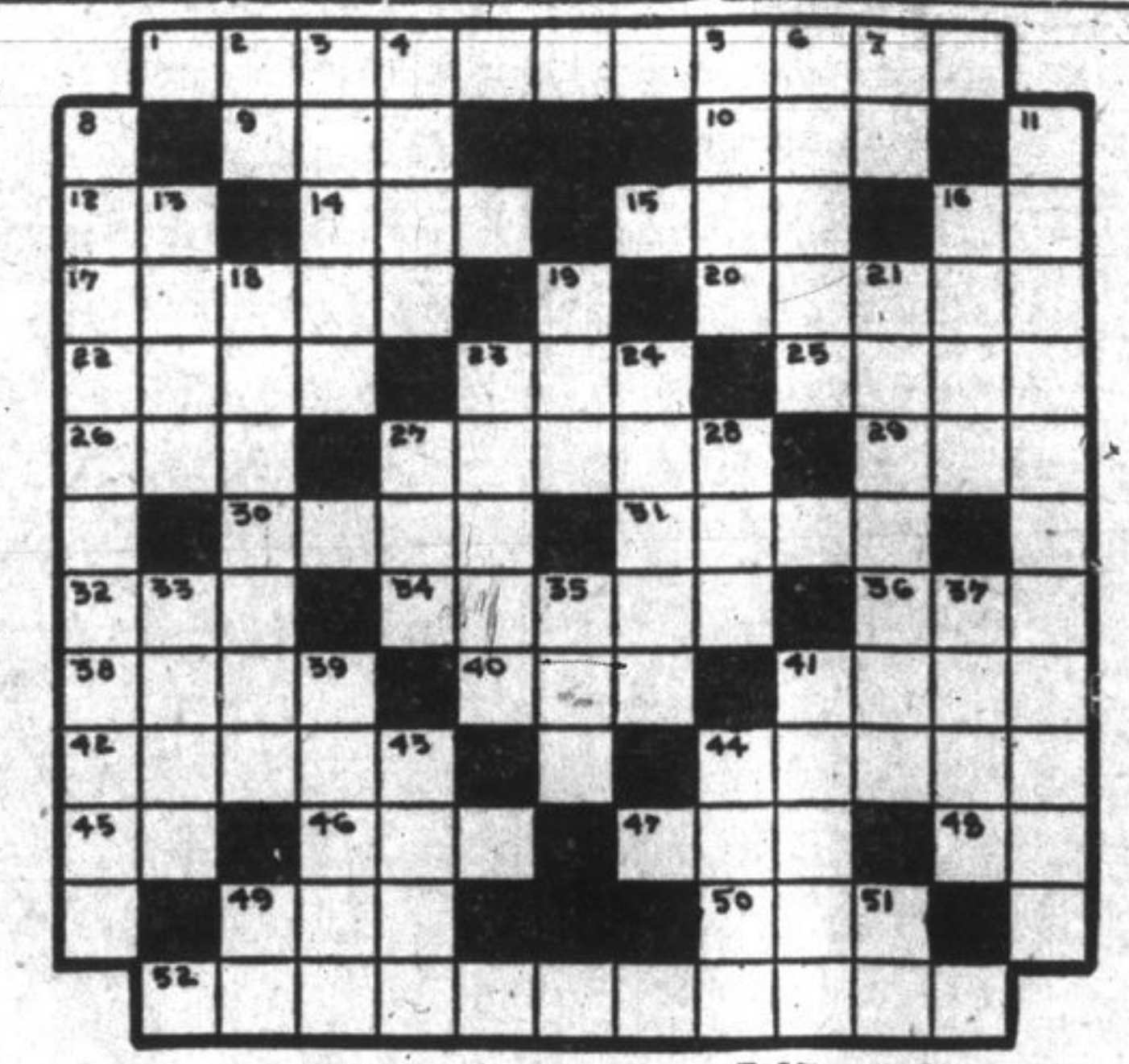

BRIEFS FROM SUNBURY.

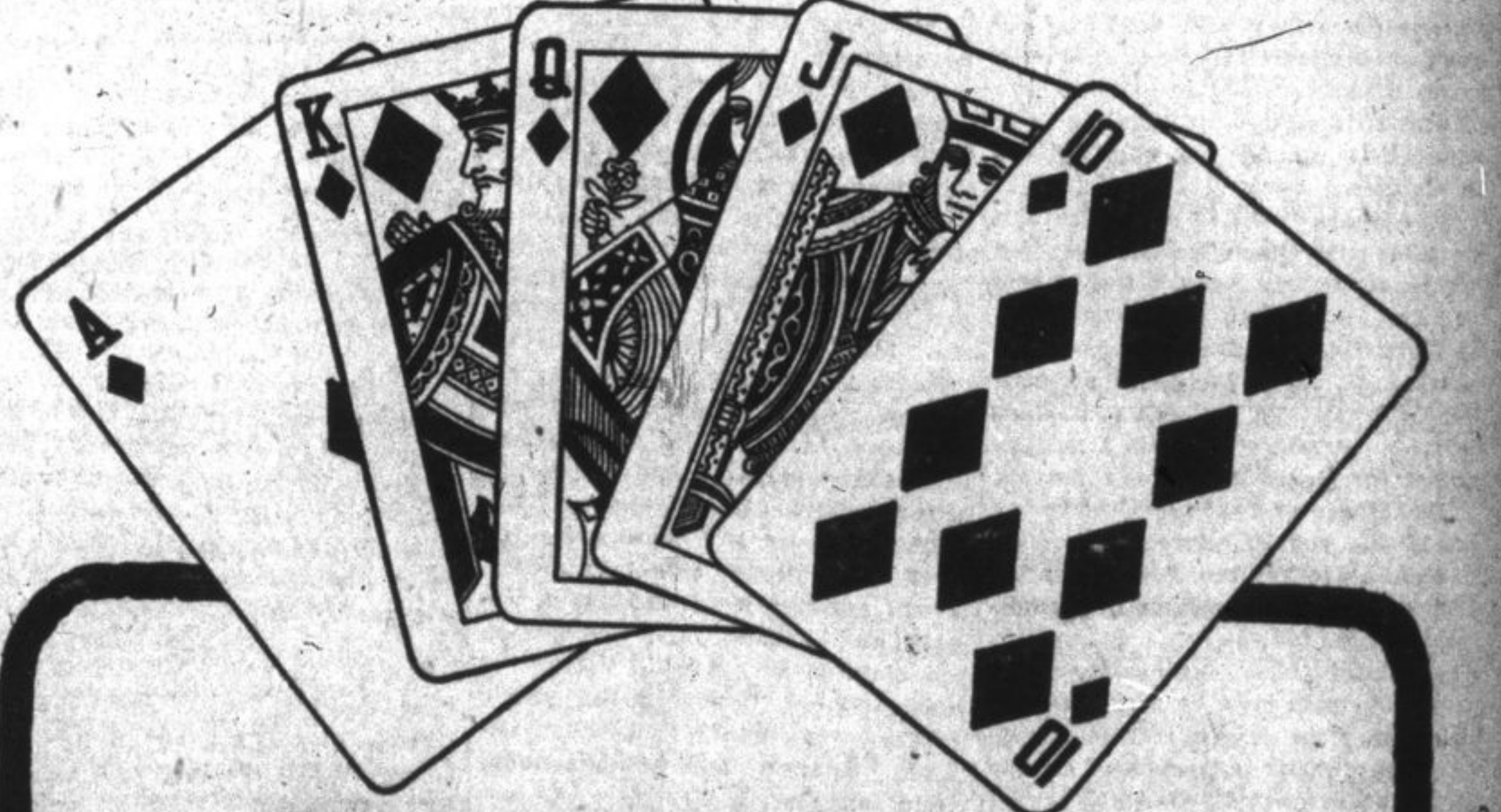
The Young Girls Have Organized a Sunshine Club.
