MAKES A PLEA FOR STRONGER FRENCH NAVY

Claimed That France Should Not Submit to Reduction in Submarines. Paris, April 17.—The French senate yesterday listened to a plea for a stronger navy from M. Raiberti, secretary of the navy budget committee. The appeal is generally taken to be of special significance because of the recent manifestation of Italian policy, notably Premier Mussolini's speeches claiming the Mediterranean as an Italian lake and his declarations of the necessity for Italian expansion.

Toronto, April 15.—Alexander T. Reid, president of the firm of A. T. Reid & Co., and director of the Dominion Bank, died at his home last evening. He was born in London, Ont., in 1862.
