CHARGE WAS DISMISSED. No Theft in Case Heard in the County Court. The charge of stealing brought against Robert Anderson, by Nelson S. Williams, both of Storrington township, in the County Police Court on Saturday, was dismissed by Magistrate Bradshaw.

The case arose from the fact that Williams was trapping on shores which Anderson claimed belonged to him. Anderson testified that he asked Williams to take up his traps and when he refused Anderson took up Williams traps and hung them in a tree with a notice on them that Williams was not to trap there any more. Whether or not Williams had a right to trap in Cranberry Lake in the places where his traps were placed was not decided by this case, but the magistrate held that the charge was theft and as there had been no theft the case was dismissed. Mr. J. Hickey acted for Mr. Anderson, and Mr. A. B. Cunningham appeared for Mr. Williams.
