CHRISTENING OF ROYAL

BABY ON SATURDAY
Their Majesties Attend the
Brief Ceremony in Buckingham Palace.

London, May 31.—Little Princess

Elizabeth Alexandra Mary, daughter of the Duke of York, the King's second son, was christened in the private chapel at Buckingham Palace Saturday afternoon.

The ceremony was brief. It was attended by the baby's four grandparents, the King and Queen, the Earl and Countess of Strathmore, besides the Duke of Connaught, Prince and Princess Arthur of Connaught and the baby's parents.

The Duke and Duchess of York arrived at the Palace a little before noon and had luncheon with the King and Queen.

The little princess, the fourth lady in the land, arrived early in the afternoon with her nurse. Before the ceremony the child slept peacefully in a cradle, kept at the palace for visiting infants.

The precursor began the christening ceremony following the arrival of the royal organist and the choir boys, dressed in crimson and gold robes, from St. James' Palace.

At the beginning of the ceremony the Princess was held by the nurse, but when the time for naming her arrived the Queen took the baby and handed her to the Archbishop of York.

Then the Archbishop made the sign of the cross on her forehead with the water brought specially from the River Jordan and placed in a gold font belonging to the collection of gold plate at Windsor Castle, and recited:

"In token that hereafter she shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified."

Then the hymn, "Praise the Lord, Ye Heavens, Adore Him," selected by the baby's mother, was sung.

Following the ceremony the register was signed by the King and Queen, the Prince of Wales, Princess Mary, the Duke of Connaught and the Earl and Countess of Strathmore.

The little Princess was dressed in a robe of old lace several feet long, which the King and the Prince of Wales wore at their christenings.
