

An Emperor Led the Way



The telephone, the semi-centennial of which is being celebrated throughout the country this year, owes its first recognition to royalty. It was Dom Pedro, emperor of Brazil, who at the Philadelphia centennial in June, 1876, noticed Alexander Graham Bell, the inventor, and listened to his instrument. Dom Pedro and his official party, who were making a private inspection of the exhibits, arrived just as the judges were about to adjourn for the day. The Brazilian emperor eyed young Bell, whom he had met in Boston where he had investigated the work in behalf of the deaf mutes, and rushed forward with outstretched arms exclaiming, "Why, Mr. Bell, what are you doing here. How are the deaf mutes of Boston?" Bell explained he had an exhibit and had hoped that the judges would give him the opportunity to demonstrate his telephone. "By all means let us see it," exclaimed the Brazilian, and all went to the table where the inventor had his instruments. Bell showed the emperor how to hold the receiver, then went away to another part of the building and spoke into the transmitter. Suddenly Dom Pedro straightened, astonishment written on every line of his face. "My God, it talks," he exclaimed, in tones of little less than awe. Thus the telephone received its first real recognition under circumstances as dramatic as the day it spoke its first words.

RIDEAU LAKE REGION OFFERS EVERY CHARM

U. S. Visitors Display Greater Appreciation Than Many Canadians.

Sportsmen and beauty lovers from New York and Ohio have for many years known and enjoyed the charms, seclusions, excellent bass fishing and duck shooting of these lovely lakes lying between the St. Lawrence and Ottawa Rivers. Yet, strangely enough, they are known and visited by few Canadians, though once you come beneath the spell of their loveliness you will be lured back again and again. The chief lakes of the Rideau chain are Big Rideau, Little Rideau, Opinicon, Indian, Clear, Benson, Newboro, Pollywog, Mosquito, Sand and a number of others. All through the region the fishing is excellent for small and large mouthed black bass, calico or strawberry bass, crappies, bluegills, soggie eyes, catfish, pickerel, pike, lake trout and muskies. The Big Rideau, the largest of the Rideau chain of lakes, reached from Portland, is a very beautiful body of clear water, with rock and sandy bottom, noted for the gameness of its grey trout and black bass. Excellent fishing for large-mouth black bass is to be had in Opinicon, Indian, Benson and Clear Lakes.

RAIN CAME IN TIME TO PLEASE FARMERS

Power Lines Suffered As a Result of The Strong Wind.

The heavy rain which fell Monday night was welcomed by the farmers, as the grain and other crops were badly in need of moisture. If a hot spell had come on before Monday night's rain, it would have done inestimable damage. Warm weather now, however, is eminently to be desired. The strong wind which accompanied the rain worked considerable damage with the electric power lines in the city, that section near Union and Albert streets being without light in the houses from 10 o'clock until after midnight. The street lights were not affected. At the corner of Arch and Union streets, some primary wires got mixed with some secondaries but did not cause any serious damage. Branches of trees blown by the wind broke down half a dozen service wires.
