## GAIETY AT POINT FREDERICK

"R.M.C. 1876-1926" flashed in the | forget-me-nots, air above the "Old Stone Frigate," valley. the oldest building in use in Ontario, on Monday evening, when the golden jubiles ball was given by the commandant, staff and gentlemen cadets of the Royal Military College of Canada. The same dates were at the end of the ballroom in the gymnasium above the college arms and pink petal frock. under the clock that told the numbers. For fifty years the lads of the Dominion have been sent Point Frederick to learn "Truth. Duty and Valor," and well they have learned their lesson.

The ball of 1926 was a brilliant one, the buildings ablaze with light, and while the rain spoiled the attractive sitting-out places on wharf, it did not in the least interfere with the gaiety within the halls of R.M.C. Col. Commandant C. F. and Mrs. Constantine seceived the throngs of guests in a marquee at the entrance to the ballroom, the white georgette, beaded. latter wearing a charming gown of white and silver brocade and carrying a great bouquet of red and white roses tied with red and white ribbons, the gift of the graduating class. Red and white streamers canopied the hall where the dancers swayed to and fro, making a gorgeous scene.

From east and west, yes, and from the south and across the seas, they came to gather in R.M.C. for the annual function known through the length and breadth of Canada as "The June Ball." Other balls may be held in June, but this is the only one that counts. Mrs. Hubert Neilson had come from Quebec to the fiftieth anniversary of the college of which her father, the late Col. Ridout, was the first adjutant. Her sister, Mrs. Sorsbie, and her husband, General R. Sorsbie, had come from England, Mr. Algernon Ridout, Quebec, was with his sisters, and Major and Mrs. Lawton Ridout, Toronto, their cousins, were also in town for the anniversary. Some of the members of the "Old Eighteen" were also present. Orville Johnston's orchestra from

Ottawa supplied the music, which was much enjoyed by the dancers. Supper was served in the mess rooms. During the evening the silhouettes that adorned the walls of the "gym" were given as souvenirs to the girl dancers, who also carried off the balloons that were released during one of the dances. Fortunately the R.M.C. is lighted with its own power, so that, although the lights were dimmed for a while, they never went out.

The grotto, with its effective decorations was a much sought retreat. scented as it was with the roses piled high on the great blocks of ice in the centre. At the end of the dance, a photograph was taken by flashlight, a contrast to the old days when the sun, rising over the St Lawrence saw men and girls who had danced all night sitting on the steps to have the sunrise picture tak-

There was an early parade of the cadets, who, after they had taken partners back to their homes, paraded at four o'clock, daylight saving time, at the college.
