

NEW MECHANICAL LABORATORY

Is Required at the Royal Military The mechanical laboratory at the

Royal Military College, at present situated in the basement under Sir Arthur Currie Hall, has been found to be too small and otherwise unsuitable. The instructional equipment is much too congested, and also, by reason of lack of space, unsuitably arranged.

In order to provide suitable accommodation for this department. the Commandant recommended that a new one storey mechanical laboratory be built to contain the mechanical, electrical, hydraulic and testing instructional equipment Such a building could be conveniently sited on the shore of Navy Bay about fifty Ontario streets, Kingston, Ont. Ope yards N.E. of Sir Arthur Currie Hall, day and night. 'Phones 39 or 283

The provision of such a building would make the present mechanical laboratory available as a draughting room, and in turn free the first class draughting room for a lecture room. An alteration or addition to the heating system of this room

would be required. Rough plans of a suitable building have been prepared. Its cost, including placing of equipment, is liberally estimated at \$20,000, with an additional \$2,500 required to convert the present room into a draughting room.


