TEACHING CHEAPER IN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL

Wellington School Gives Many Advantages Not Found in Old System.

(Picton Gazette) After operating through four winters during which hold-ups in transporting pupils have not averaged more than a day and a half, the consolidated school at Wellington now claims to have successfully passed the acid test. When the writer visited this section of Prince Edward county over five years ago quite a controversy was raging over consolidation. "It would be too expensive. It would be impossible to transport pupils to and from school in winter. There would be no advantage over the old one-room country school in which some of the most prominent Prince Edward County men had received their early education." These were the arguments of the opponents of the scheme to unite the half dozen small schools in and about the village under one head.

Despite opposition the majority of the ratepayers favored the plan and a new school was built in 1922. The building is modern in every respect. There is steam heating with hot and cold running water, wash rooms, drinking fountains, septic tanks, electric lights, automatic ventilation, scientifically designed; instead of shivering in a one-room schoolhouse heated by a single stove, the pupils are as comfortable as in the most modern of city buildings. There are ten class rooms, all for public school pupils, three for high school work, and one for domestic science. In addition there is a community hall about 40 by 65 feet with a stage for entertainment by students and townspeople, and underneath is a gymnasium the same size, filled with the latest equipment. This room is also open to teams and classes from people who are past school age. During the cold weather one of the teachers and the domestic science class prepare on electric stoves hot soup and cocoa, which are supplied gratis to students bringing their lunch. Boys and girls have each a comfortable well-lighted room in which the noonday meal is eaten.

sent secretary-treasurer. "In the more than ten of the 54 would have been able to go. Although we get a better teaching service because our institution is graded and takes up four years of high school work, we actually save money on salaries, because fewer teachers are necessary. Outside of capital cost, our maintenance charge is lower than it was before we consolidated. And while we hear some complaints around town about the capital charges, it should be remembered that many of our one-room schoolhouses were falling apart and would have had to be rebuilt that we have a modern community hall and gymnasium in the district to-day, whereas in the old days there was practically no place to meet when the weather was cold."

No Transportation Troubles. As previously stated, there is no trouble about transporting the pupils. These come from a radius of seven miles and, outside those living in Wellington village, are brought in by five motor vans in the summer and horse-drawn sleighs in the winter. Even from the greatest distance the trip does not average an hour, a little more in the winter, much less when the motors are operating. There is no waiting in the snow. Children are picked up at the farm gate, parents being notified by telephone just when the vans will be coming along. Five minutes after school is dismissed the pupils are on their way home.
