FIFTY ORANGE LODGES
MARCH IN BELLEVILLE

The Procession Over a Mile in
Length—The Addresses
Delivered.

Belleville, July 13.—It is esti-
mated that 10,000 visitors were in
this city yesterday when one of the
best Orange celebrations, which has
taken place in Eastern Ontario for
some years, took place. Over 50
lodges from Hastings, Prince Ed-
ward, Lennox and Addington and
Frontenac counties were represent-
ed in the parade, which was more
than a mile in length. After parad-
ing through the principal streets of
the city the parade ended up at the
new agricultural park, where an in-
teresting programme was carried
out. Many Promises: Orangemen
were in attendance. Appropriate ad-
dressers during the afternoon were
made by J. F. Hill, M.P., for East
Hastings, who was chairman of the
gathering; W. S. Ireland, M.P., for
West Hastings; H. Collier, M.P.,
P.P. for Prince Edward; E. W.
Tummon, Ex-M.P., for South Hast-
ings; S. Kerr and Mrs. Gillespie, of
Parth, provincial grand auditor of

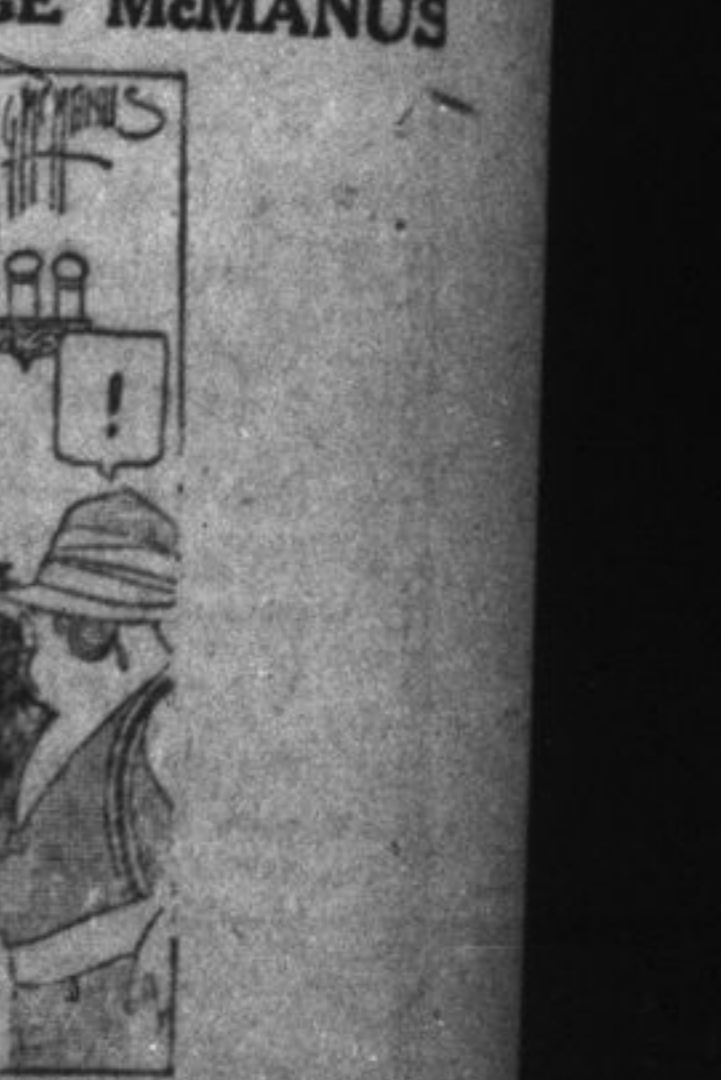
