TO BOOST FEES OF MEDICAL STUDENTS

At Toronto University—How They Compare With Other Colleges.

The Board of Governors of the University of Toronto has decided to increase the fees to students in Medicine, of all years except the first, from \$150 to \$200 per annum. This increase will apply to the session 1927-28.

McGill University is increasing its fees to the medical student to \$250 per annum. In the University of Montreal the fee is from \$207 to \$214; in Dalhousie University \$207; in the University of Alberta \$182; in the University of Manitoba \$180 to \$185; in Western University \$155 to \$183; in Queen's University, Kingston, \$148 to \$160. These include hospital fees and students' union fees.
