Sir William was a great doctor, and his name is known to every bacteriologist and almost every medical prac-titioner the world over in connection with the Leishman stain for the microscopical examination of blood and for his works on tropical diseases ending in the discovery of "Leishman bodies" circulating in the blood in the obscure Oriental fever, Kala-azar.

Sir William had a distinguished army and medical career. He was thrice mentioned in despatches during the Great War, was made a Commander of the Legion of Honor, and was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal of the United States. He was Director-General of the Army Medical Service.
