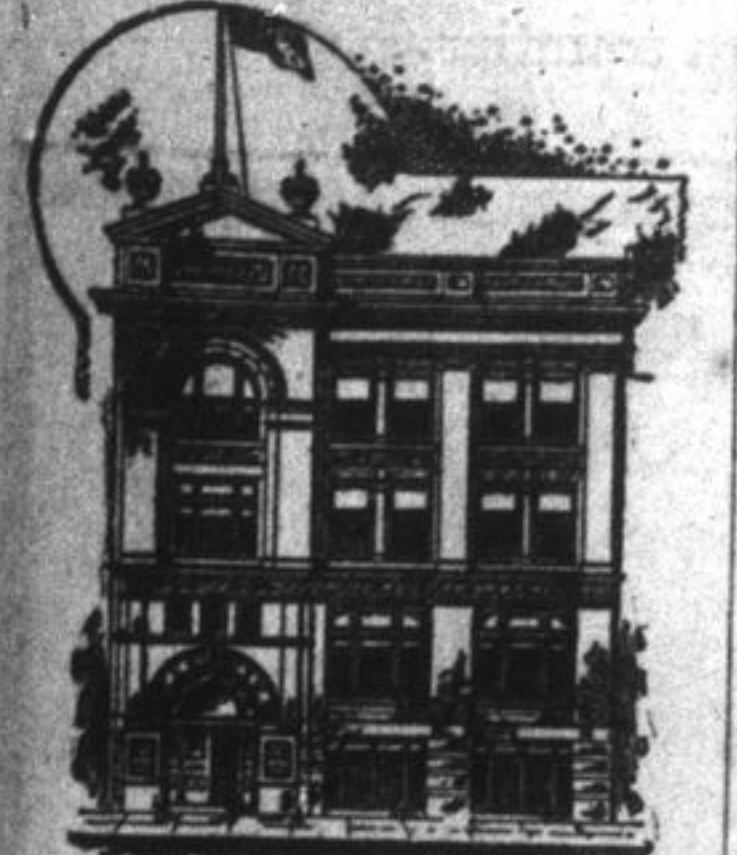

THE PEOPLE WILL REMEMBER.

It is significant that in the speeches of Premier Meighen there is no reference to the legislation the King Government enacted during the past session for the benefit of the people and for their relief from taxation.

Not a word is said by Premier Meighen of the reduction in the duties on automobiles, which has brought down the prices of cars, increased the sales, and given a fresh impetus to the automobile industry.

Not a word about the increase in our export trade to \$1,315,000,000 and the favorable balance of about \$400,000,000.

Not a word about the flourishing condition of the National Railways with an operating deficit giving place to an operating surplus of \$32,000,000.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT.

Dr. William Bennett Munro of Harvard University, one of the United States' leading authorities on the question of government, says: "Since the war a dozen new and free governments have been set up in Europe. Despite our monumental power and prosperity, despite our world leadership, despite our exalted opinion of ourselves politically, not one of these countries has seen fit to adopt a single governmental device or method drawn from the United States."

As Dr. Munro is a native of Almonte, Ontario, and an honor graduate of Queen's University, Kingston, thirty years back, his reference to the United States political system is of particular interest to his old friends in Kingston and to graduates of Queen's generally. The political system of the States is not likely to be copied by any European nation, which will rather look to the British system of constitutional government.
