HIGHWAY CONDITIONS

Toronto to Quebec Boundary — 390.3 miles—Pavement good, gravel sections fair throughout.

Pavement good from Toronto to five miles east of Cobourg, except between Newcastle and Port Hope, where there are short sections of gravel road in fair condition.

From five miles east of Cobourg to Trenton the gravel road is under construction.

From Trenton to Quebec Boundary pavement and surface-treated macadam in good condition throughout, except where construction work is going on and short sections may be rough.

Penetration macadam construction (no detours) proceeding west of Morrisburg, Cardinal, Brockville, Lansdowne and Gananogue.

Traffic may be delayed for fifteen minutes on some sections where construction work is proceeding.

Tarring operations are now in progress Shannonville to Marysville, west of Brockville, East of Cardinal.

Quebec Boundary to Montreal—Quebec Highway No. 27. — 55.11 miles.

Resurfacing under way from boundary to Ottawa Landing. Good from here to Montreal.

Kingston to Ottawa via Rideau Lakes, Perth, Smith's Falls and Carleton Place—131 miles. Fair condition throughout.

Resurfacing under way from east and west of Carleton Place. No detours.

Surface-treated macadam road from Kingston to Joyceville, continued by a gravel road to Smith's Falls.

Grading is proceeding north of Joyceville and west of Portland, and short sections of the road will be rough.

No detours. From Smith's Falls to Ashton Post Office, the surface-treated macadam road is in fair condition.

Tarring operations east and west of Carleton Place. Ashton to Stittville the gravel road is in
