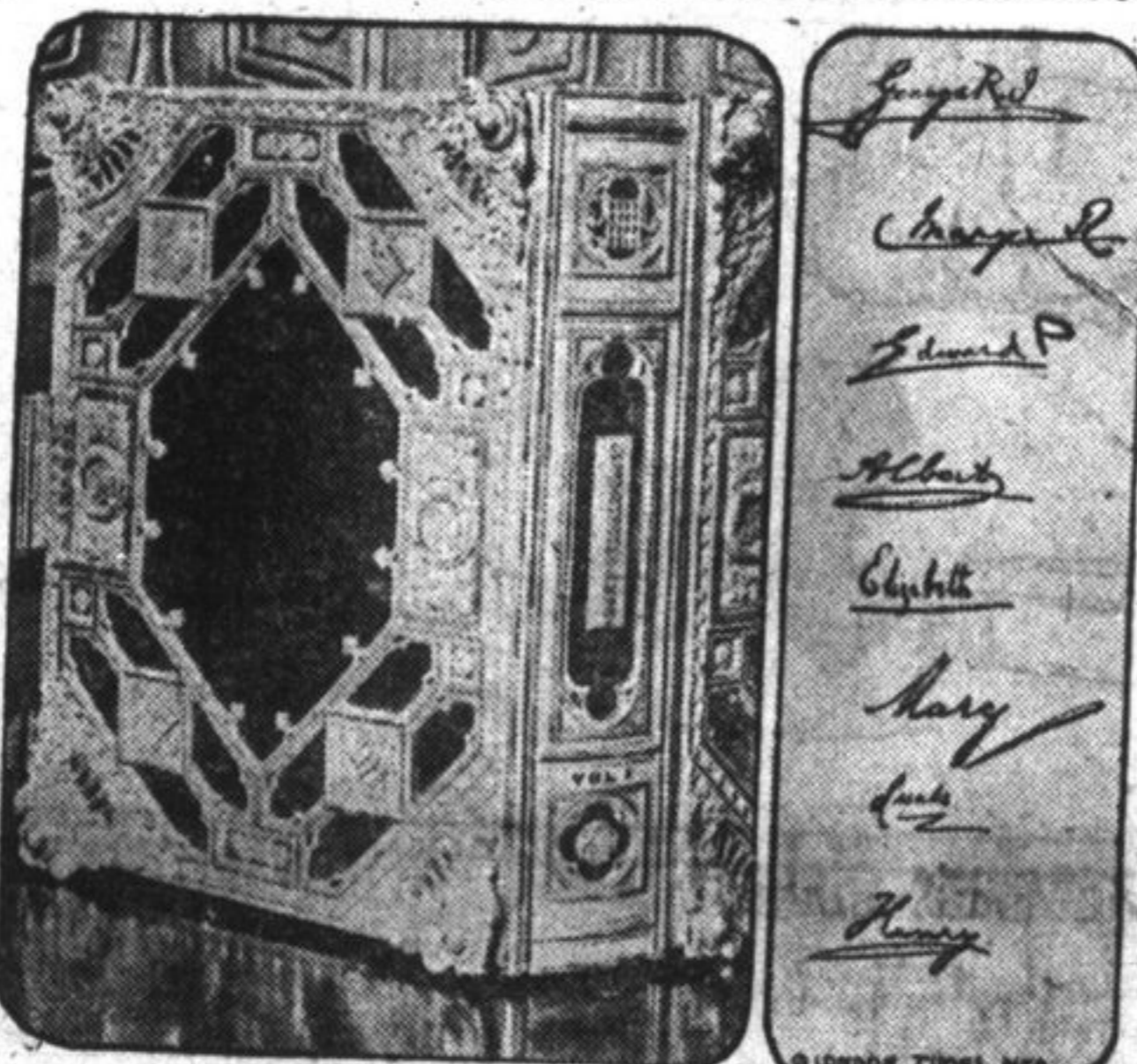


Katherine Burke showing how to brush the eyebrows.

Symptoms—Scant, scraggly condition of the eyebrows, instead of a normal luxuriant growth.

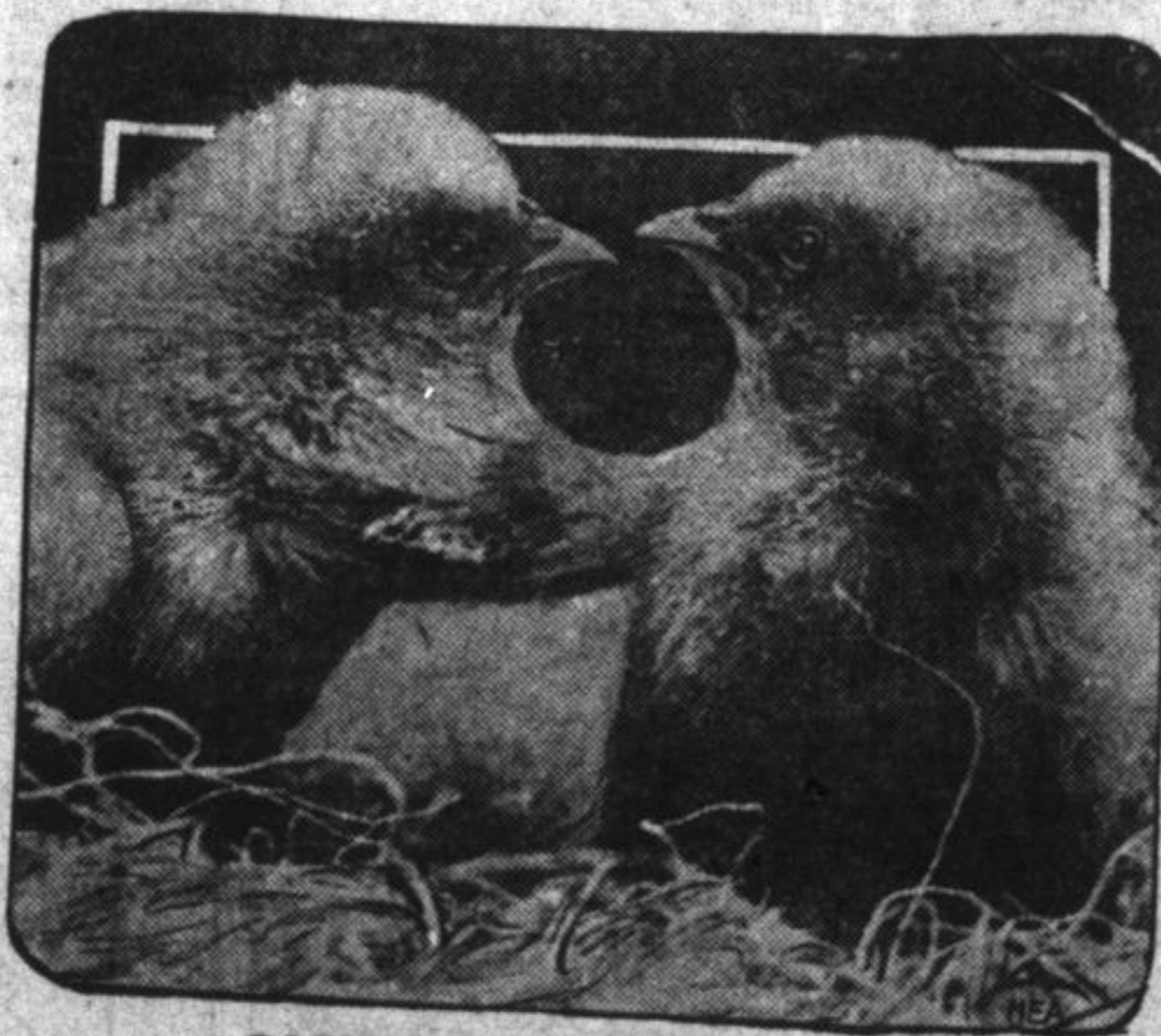
Diagnosis—This is often the result of improper diet. Or the same condition which prevails on the scalp and causes the hair to fall may be responsible. Usually local attention is sufficient.

Treatment—Invest in some white vaseline and an eyebrow brush—a few cents only. Brush the brows night and morning, and then rub over the surface with the vaseline. This stimulates circulation and encourages growth. Pulling the brows strengthens them if you aren't too vigorous about it. Just take a portion firmly between the thumb and the forefinger and pull with an even pressure—not a jerk. If a few linger in your grasp, don't worry, as others will grow in to take their places.



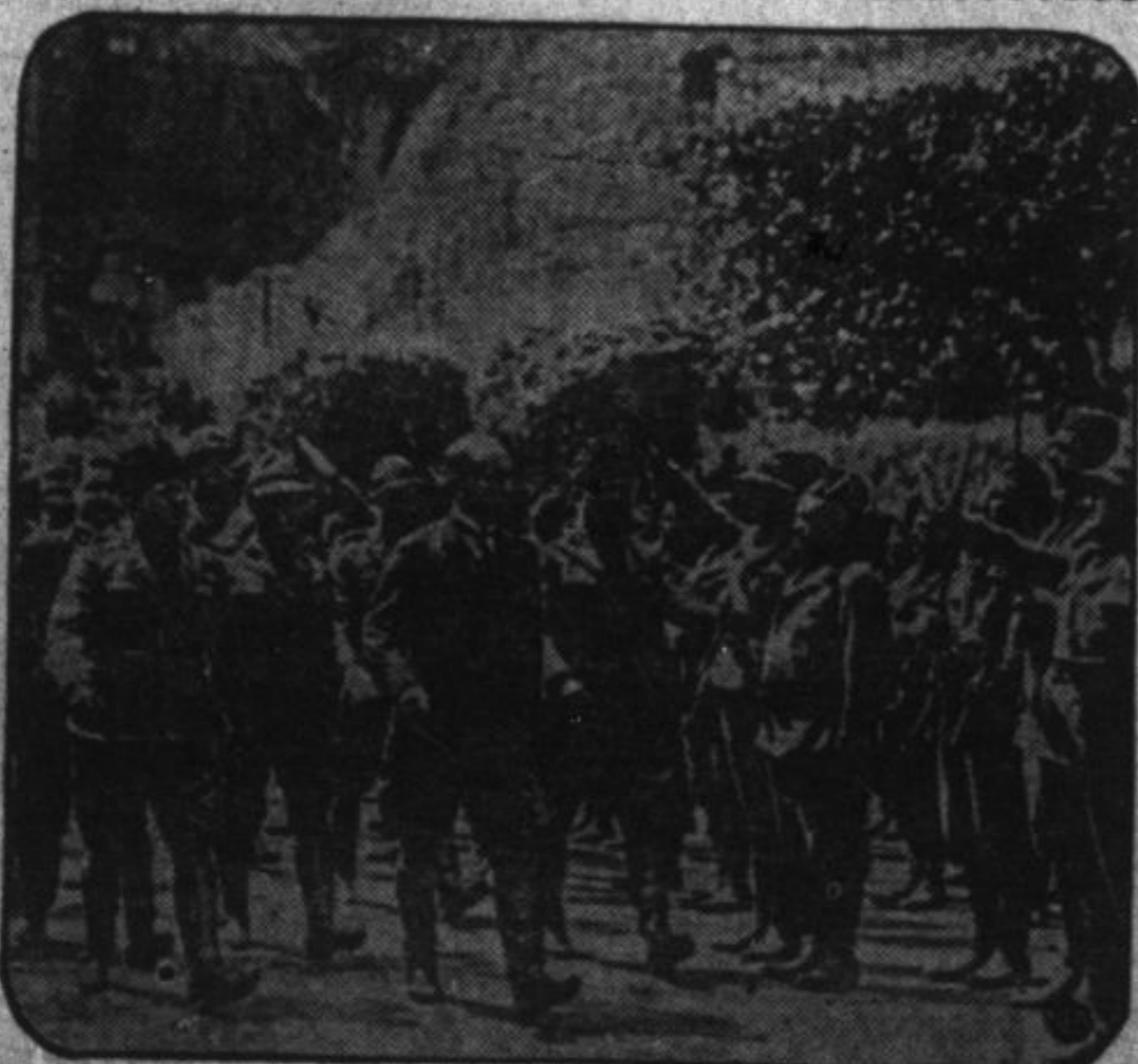
HOW ROYALTY WRITES
